ANNEX

Statement made on 13 June 1986 by the spokesman for the  
Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Coalition Government  
of Democratic Kampuchea condemning the reimposition of  
the state of emergency in South Africa

The people of Kampuchea and the Coalition Government of Democratic Kampuchea are deeply concerned at the new aggravation of the situation in South Africa caused by the policy of apartheid, and are outraged by the intensification of the bloody and massive repression carried out by the Pretoria racist régime against the opponents of apartheid since it reimposed the state of emergency on 12 June 1986.

The people of Kampuchea and the Coalition Government of Democratic Kampuchea condemn with the utmost vigour these crimes perpetrated by the Pretoria authorities and demand that they immediately lift this state of emergency and put an end forthwith to their odious system of apartheid.

On the eve of the World Conference on Sanctions against South Africa and on the occasion of the tenth anniversary of the Soweto massacre of 16 June 1976, the people of Kampuchea and the Coalition Government of Democratic Kampuchea join their voices to that of the entire international community to request that all possible measures be taken with a view to hastening the end of apartheid. They again pay a solemn tribute to the memory of the schoolchildren and students of Soweto and to the memory of the other martyrs of the South African people who have fallen in the struggle for the eradication of apartheid. They also wish to reiterate their fraternal solidarity with and firm support for this just struggle of the South African people to live in honour and human dignity in a democratic South Africa, united and not based on the colour of the skin, in which all inhabitants would participate freely in determining their future.
