The Chargé d'affaires of the Democratic Republic of Afghanistan to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to inform that the Chargé d'affaires of the Pakistan Embassy at Kabul was summoned to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Democratic Republic of Afghanistan on 19 May 1986 and the following was conveyed to him by the Director of the First Political Division of the Ministry:

The Pakistan military authorities have again claimed that the armed forces of the Democratic Republic of Afghanistan invaded the regions of Kutal Paywar and Shadalsal near Parachinar on 5 May 1986, the region of Kuram Agency on 8 May 1986, Posta Kuti on 8 May 1986, the region of Dobandi of Chaman on 9 May 1986, and the region of Teri Mangal of Kuram Agency on 13 May 1986.

The Government of the Democratic Republic of Afghanistan, after a full investigation and assessment, finds the allegations baseless and void of truth and completely rejects them. The Government of the Democratic Republic of Afghanistan demands that the Pakistan military authorities should end making such blatant allegations which result in nothing but the deterioration of the situation on the frontier areas.
