LETTER DATED 30 JUNE 1986 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF CYPRUS TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL.

I have the honour to transmit herewith the text of a resolution unanimously adopted by the House of Representatives of the Republic of Cyprus on 26 June 1986, concerning the announced visit of the Prime Minister of Turkey Mr. Ozal, to the occupied areas of the Republic of Cyprus.

## Resolution unanimously adopted by the House of Representatives of the Republic of Cyprus on 26 June 1986

The House of Representatives of the Republic of Cyprus,

Considering that the announced visit of the Prime Minister of Turkey, Mr. Ozal, to the occupied areas of Cyprus is one more step in the recent series of provocations and threats by Turkish officials,

Declaring that the intended visit of the Turkish Prime Minister is part of a series of actions which aim at the consolidation of <u>faits accomplis</u> directed against the independence, sovereignty and territorial integrity of the Republic of Cyprus,

Pointing out that instead of conforming to the United Nations resolution which demands the revocation of the secessionist actions, Turkey, with this action seeks to underline its recognition of the illegal secessionist régime in the occupied areas of Cyprus, in contravention of resolutions 541 (1983) and 550 (1984) of the United Nations Security Council,

Considering that this new provocative action undermines efforts for a peaceful and viable solution of the Cyprus problem,

- 1. Condemns the action of the Prime Minister of Turkey Mr. Ozal in visiting the occupied part of Cyprus,
- 2. Calls on the Turkish Government to halt its provocative actions against Cyprus, to conform to the resolutions of the United Nations and to withdraw its troops and terminate the occupation of the northern part of the Republic of Cyprus,
- 3. Calls on the United Nations Organization to take action for the cancellation of the visit of the Turkish Prime Minister, an action which undermines the efforts of the United Nations for the achievement of a peaceful solution of the Cyprus problem,
- 4. Calls on all Parliaments, Governments and international organizations to remonstrate with the Government of Turkey so that it calls a halt to the policy of faits accomplis which it is following in Cyprus,
- 5. Declares its insistence on the solution of the Cyprus problem in the context of the relevant decisions of the United Nations, including resolutions 541 and 550 of the Security Council, and the High Level Agreements.
