Telex dated 18 June 1986 from the President of the World Conference on Sanctions against Racist South Africa, Paris, 16-20 June 1986

The World Conference on Sanctions against Racist South Africa assembled in Paris has been apprised of the meeting of the Security Council to examine the recent aggression by the Pretoria régime's forces against the port of Namibe in the People's Republic of Angola, as a result of which two merchant ships were sunk, one of which was loaded with foodstuffs from UNICEF for the Angolan population.

These facts reveal once more the need to adopt the sanctions envisaged for cases like this in the Charter of the United Nations.

The Conference looks forward to the Security Council's unanimous approval of a resolution condemning this new and serious act of aggression committed by the globally repudiated <u>apartheid</u> régime with an aim to prevent its continued unpunished aggressions against the countries of southern Africa.
