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PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1978-1979

Report of the Fifth Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Hamzah Mohammed HAMZAH (Syrian Arab Republic)

- 1. In view of the desire of the General Assembly to recess on 21 December, and considering the fact that the Fifth Committee will not be able to conclude its work by that date, the present report has been prepared to enable the General Assembly to take an interim action on the revised appropriations for the biennium 1978-1979.
- 2. Recommendations of the Fifth Committee on revised estimates submitted by the Secretary-General, as well as on the financial implications of resolutions adopted by the General Assembly under items considered by other Main Committees, have involved additional appropriations in the amount of \$10,459,600 and additional estimates of income in the amount of \$3,597,400. DECISIONS OF THE COMMITTEE

4. At its 68th meeting, on 20 December, the Fifth Committee considered the revised estimates of income and expenditure to be recommended for approval by the General Assembly at the end of the first part of its current session for the biennium 1978-1979.
