For the existing text substitute
14. Replies to the inquiry were received from 62 Governments. Of the responding countries, 33 are "retentionist" (Afghanistan, Algeria, Argentina, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Barbados, Benin, Bolivia, Botswana, Chile, Cyprus, El Salvador, Ethiopia, France, Greece, Guyana, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Japan, Kuwait, Morocco, Poland, Romania, Rwanda, Samoa, Singapore, Sudan, Syrian Arab Repubiic, United Republic of Tanzania, Tunisia and Zambia), 16 are "abolitionist" (Austria, Cape Verde, Colombia, Costa Rica, Denmark, Ecuador, Finland, Germany, Federal Republic of, Iceland, Luxembourg, Norway, Panama, Portugal, Sweden, Uruguay and Venezuela), 12 are "abolitionist for ordinary crimes only" (Brazil, Canada, Fiji, Israel, Italy, ITalta, Mexico, Nepal, ITetherlands, Seychelles, Spain and United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) and one is "abolitionist by custom" (Belgium). It is to be noted that the category "retentionist" includes many countries, such as Cyprus, El Salvador, Greece, Guyana, Lebanon, Madagascar, Samoa and Zambia, in thich no executions have taken place during the current reporting period.
