I. INTRODUCTION

1. The annual report of the Secretary-General on the composition of the Secretariat is submitted in accordance with a number of resolutions of the General Assembly, the most recent of which are resolutions 39/245 of 19 December 1984 and 40/258 A of 18 December 1985. The present report contains information on recruitment efforts between 1 July 1985 and 30 June 1986, and on the composition of the staff of the United Nations Secretariat as at 30 June 1986, as compared with previous years. This information, which is contained mainly in the statistical tables in the annex to the report, permits an assessment of the distribution of the staff by nationality, sex and type of appointment, in the light of the principles contained in the Charter of the United Nations and the guidelines set forth by the General Assembly. Reports in response to other requests of the General Assembly in resolution 40/258 A and decision 40/469 of 18 December 1985 are being submitted separately.

2. During the period between 1 July 1985 and 30 June 1986, two major events occurred which have had considerable impact on the current composition of the Secretariat: first, the staff of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO), which became a specialized agency in 1985, ceased to be a part of the United Nations Secretariat on 1 January 1986; and secondly, recruitment was suspended from 21 March 1986 as a result of the current financial crisis.

3. Following the separation of UNIDO's staff on 1 January 1986, four Member States became underrepresented. As of the same date, new desirable ranges have been introduced on an interim basis to reflect the reduction of the Secretariat staff by the 347 UNIDO posts actually occupied which had been subject to geographical distribution. The interim ranges are calculated on a base figure of 3,000 posts rather than the figure of 3,350 posts established by resolution 35/210 of 17 December 1980.

4. The suspension of recruitment also had a bearing on the representation of Member States in the Secretariat. For example, five Member States that were within their desirable ranges on 31 December 1985 have since become underrepresented as at 30 June 1986. A substantial number of recruitment of nationals of unrepresented and underrepresented Member States (see para. 6) and recruitment of women, which were ready for review and approval in March 1986, have been deferred. The recruitment of candidates from the 1985 national competitive examinations - most of them also from unrepresented and underrepresented Member States - was also deferred.

II. RECRUITMENT

A. Principles governing recruitment

5. The principles contained in Article 101, paragraph 3, of the Charter of the United Nations, apply to all the staff of the United Nations, including the staff of the secretariats of United Nations organs with a special status in matters of

appointment. The system of desirable ranges has been established by the General Assembly as a guideline for the geographical distribution of only a group of staff in the Professional category and above, who are appointed by the Secretary-General for at least one year to the Secretariat of the United Nations. They are known as staff in "posts subject to geographical distribution". This group is described in detail in another report of the Secretary-General on the system of desirable ranges. The General Assembly has repeatedly requested that imbalances in the distribution of this group of staff should be corrected as soon as possible and has provided specific guidelines on this matter, most recently in resolution 40/258 A.

6. The representation of Member States in posts subject to geographical distribution in the Secretariat is assessed by comparison with the desirable ranges calculated for each State. The interim ranges in force since 1 January 1986 (see paras. 2 and 3), are indicated in table 9 of the statistical annex to the present report. According to this guideline, Member States fall into four categories: unrepresented, when none of their nationals is serving in a post subject to geographical distribution; underrepresented, when the number of their nationals serving in such posts is lower than the lower limit of their desirable ranges; within range, when the number of their nationals serving in such posts is within the limits of their ranges; and overrepresented, when the number of their nationals serving in such posts exceeds the upper limit of their desirable ranges. Table A shows the number of staff from each region in posts subject to geographical distribution and the number of Member States in each region in each of the above four categories as compared with the previous four years.

B. Major recruitment steps taken

7. The measures introduced in 1984 in order to correct more rapidly the existing imbalances in the geographical representation of Member States and in the representation of men and women in the Secretariat were continued until the suspension of recruitment. These measures comprise the establishment of targets for each department or office, the holding of competitive examinations and the systematic use of vacancy announcements.

8. First, specific targets continued to be established every six months in the context of the medium-term recruitment plan for 1986-1987 for each department and office, including the secretariats of regional commissions, for the recruitment of qualified nationals from unrepresented and underrepresented Member States and of qualified women. These targets, as well as the results of the efforts made to implement them in each organizational unit concerned during the period from July 1985 to June 1986, are shown in table B below.

9. Secondly, the provisions of resolution 39/245, section I, paragraph 6 (a), concerning recruitment at the P-1 and P-2 levels exclusively through competitive examinations, as reflected in Secretary-General's Bulletin ST/SGB/210 of 22 January 1985, continued to be applied strictly and the number of exceptions to the examination procedure was reduced. However, because of the suspension of recruitment, most of the successful candidates in the 1985 national competitive examinations have not yet been recruited, thus reducing drastically the number of recruitment from unrepresented and underrepresented countries. The introduction, in 1986, on an experimental basis, of a competitive examination at the P-3 level, approved by the Assembly at its fortieth session, was, however, postponed.

C. Results obtained

10. Between 1 July 1985 and 30 June 1986, 188 appointments were made to posts subject to geographical distribution. Of these 3, or 1.6 per cent, were of nationals from unrepresented Member States; 42, or 22.3 per cent, were of nationals from underrepresented Member States; 131 or 69.7 per cent, were of nationals from Member States that were within range; and 12, or 6.4 per cent, were of nationals from overrepresented Member States. Among these were 22 successful candidates from national competitive examinations organized before 1985.

11. The figures cited in the previous paragraph are computed on the basis of the status of representation of each Member State at the end of the previous reporting year, on 30 June, as communicated to the General Assembly in the reports on the composition of the Secretariat.

12. On 30 June 1986, there were 12 unrepresented Member States, 1/ compared to 13 on 30 June 1985. This has resulted from the appointment of nationals of Djibouti (1) and Qatar (2) and the separation of one national of Antigua and Barbuda during the reporting period. On the same date, 30 June 1986, there also were 24 underrepresented Member States 2/ compared to 15 at the beginning of the reporting year. As explained in paragraphs 3 and 4 above, this increase in the number of underrepresented Member States is primarily due to the change of status of UNIDO and the suspension of recruitment activities.

13. Between 1 July 1985 and 30 June 1986, 34 women were appointed to posts subject to geographical distribution, representing 18.1 per cent of the total recruited, compared with 19.2 per cent the previous year.

III. COMPOSITION OF THE SECRETARIAT

A. Total staff of the United Nations

14. Aside from the power of appointment of the Secretary-General under Article 101 of the Charter, a special status in matters of appointment has been granted by the General Assembly to some United Nations organs. Table C shows, as at 30 June 1986, the total number of staff with appointments for a year or more who are assigned to the Secretariat of the United Nations and to the secretariats of the United Nations organs with special status in matters of appointment. The table distinguishes between staff in the Professional category and above, technical co-operation project personnel, and staff in the General Service and related categories. To permit a correlation of the figures of total staff of the Secretariat with the regular budget of the United Nations, this table further distinguishes between staff in posts financed in whole or in part from the United Nations regular budget and staff in posts financed from extrabudgetary sources.

B. Staff at the senior level

15. Table D has been prepared in response to a concern of the General Assembly, which, in resolution 40/258, requested the Secretary-General to continue to ensure the representation of developing countries and other countries in senior and policy-formulating posts, with due regard to equitable geographical distribution, and in accordance with the relevant resolutions of the General Assembly.

16. This table shows the distribution of staff in posts at the senior level (D-1 and above) subject to geographical distribution according to the general criteria for the grouping of Member States resulting from General Assembly resolution 2152 (XXI) of 17 November 1966, as updated in resolution 39/234 of 18 December 1984. Member States are grouped as follows: Group A - developing countries in Africa, Asia and the Middle East; Group B - countries with developed market economies; Group C - developing countries in Latin America and the Caribbean; and Group D - countries with centrally planned economies. The table shows the situation for the years 1982 to 1986, indicating the number of Member States in each group, the sum of the mid-points of their desirable ranges, a range for each group and both the total number of their nationals in posts subject to geographical distribution and in posts at the senior level. The table includes in brackets the number and percentage of women.

17. Table E has been prepared in response to another concern of the General Assembly, which, in resolution 37/235, stressed the importance of having the largest possible number of Member States represented at the higher levels of the Secretariat, that is, the D-2 level and above, and requested the Secretary-General to include in his annual reports on the composition of the Secretariat information on the progress made in respect of the improvement of geographical distribution in the Secretariat, particularly at the higher levels. Additional information can be found in table 9 of the annex to this report.

C. Representation of women

18. The number of women and men at each level in posts subject to geographical distribution on 30 June 1986 is shown by region in table 7A of the annex to this report. The degree to which the percentage of women in posts subject to geographical distribution has increased for each region between 30 June 1976 and 30 June 1986 is shown in table F below.

19. Table G shows the number of women compared with the total number of staff in posts subject to geographical distribution and in posts with special language requirements at each level compared with the situation in 1976. As shown in this table, the percentage of women in posts with special language requirements continues to be higher than in posts subject to geographical distribution.

20. Table H shows the proportion of women in posts subject to geographical distribution within each organizational element as of 30 June 1986. Table 17 of the annex contains additional information on the distribution by sex of staff in the Professional category and above and in the General Service and related categories.

21. In resolution 37/235, the General Assembly also called upon the Secretary-General to include in this report statistical analyses of the number and percentage of women by nationality on all appointment lists, specifying women as a percentage of those appointed from outside, within each grade. The number, sex, nationality and level of staff appointed to posts subject to geographical distribution during the reporting period 1985-1986 are shown in table 11 of the annex. Additional information with respect to the appointment of men and women is contained in table I.
