(c) Total contributions to the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and the United Nations Fund for Population Activities (UNFPA) amounted to \$1,316 million in 1985, an increase of 4 per cent over 1984. Contributions to the UNDP-administered trust funds and to the other funds and programmes of the United Nations amounted to \$153 million, a drop over the previous year's figure of \$165 million. Contributions to the main programme resources of UNDP stagnated at less than \$700 million for the sixth consecutive year. Contributions to UNICEF began to increase again after the drop of the 1983-1984 period. Contributions to WFP in 1985 (\$809 million) were slightly lower than the total of contributions to UNDP and to its trust funds;

Paragraph 5 (a) should read

(a) The principal source of the growth in expenditures was WFP (up by \$100 million, including expenditures on emergency food aid); UNICEF, UNDP and UNFPA experienced less significant increases;

4. Annex

Paragraph 24 should read

24. General resource income for UNICEF for 1986 is estimated at approximately \$275 million, which is a 10 per cent increase over 1985 income, a large part of which is due to currency changes. For 1986, government contributions to general resource income will increase by \$30 million. Supplementary fund income will total approximately \$125 million. This income will consist of approximately \$90 million in specifically funded projects and \$35 million in response to the Executive Director's emergency appeal for Africa. In view of the current economic and political climate, UNICEF has adopted what it considers to be a realistic forecast for the period 1987-1989. Both general resource and supplementary fund income are forecast to grow at approximately 4 per cent per annum during the period. As a result, total income (including the Greeting Card Operation) is estimated to increase from approximately \$400 million in 1986 to \$461 million in 1989.
