Letter dated 31 October 1986 from the Permanent Representative of
Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter dated 28 October 1986 (A/41/774-S/18433), I have the honour to inform you that the Government of Pakistan has rejected as baseless the allegation made by the Kabul authorities that, on 24 October 1986, the Barikot area of the Kunar province was shelled from the Pakistan side of the border. Pakistan's rejection of the allegation was conveyed to the Afghan Chargé d'affaires on 29 October 1986.

I request you to have this letter circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under agenda items 26, 68, 69, 124, 129 and 133, and of the Security Council.
