Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. As indicated in document A/41/101 of 18 February 1986, it will be necessary for the General Assembly, during its current session, to appoint six persons to fill vacancies in the membership of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions resulting from the expiration, on 31 December 1986, of the terms of office of Mr. Henrik Amnéus, Mr. Luiz Sergio Gama Figueira, Mr. Ma Longde, Mr. Andrew Robin Murray, Mr. Banbit A. - 2. Mr. Ma Longde entered the Poreign Ministry of the People's Republic of China in 1950. He served as Vice-Consul, Consul and Second Secretary at the Chinese Consulates-General in Bombay of India and Karachi of Pakistan and at the Chinese Embassy in the Philippines from 1953 to 1961, 1973 to 1975 and 1975 to 1977 respectively. During his tenure at these posts, he was in charge of administrative and budgetary matters. From 1962 to 1972 he was Deputy Division Chief in the Department of Asian Affairs and from 1977 to 1978 he was Assistant Director of the General Office in the Foreign Ministry of China. He was Deputy Director of the Department of International Organizations and Conferences in the Foreign Ministry from December 1981 to April 1983 and since then he has been Minister in the same Department.

Mr. Ma was Service Chief at the director level in the Office of General Services at United Nations Headquarters from August 1978 to September 1981.

In 1982 and 1983, Mr. Ma participated in the thirty-eighth and thirty-ninth sessions of the United Nations Commission on Human Rights as China's Deputy Representative and in the United Nations seminars on human rights of the Asian and Pacific regions and of the Palestinian occupied territories as China's chief participant. He was China's representative to the Fifth Committee of the General Assembly at its thirty-eighth, thirty-ninth and fortieth sessions. Since 1984, he has served on the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions.
