Letter dated 26 November 1986 from the Permanent Representative of
Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter dated 24 November 1986 (A/41/885-S/18479), I have the honour to report to you a serious incident in violation of Pakistan territory from the Afghanistan side, which occurred on 21 November 1986. On that date, at 2100 hours (Pakistan standard time), the Afghan armed forces fired 7 rounds, which landed in the area approximately 10 kilometres south-west of Arawali in the Kurram Agency, as a result of which one Afghan refugee was killed.

The Afghan Chargé d'affaires was summoned to the Foreign Office in Islamabad on 26 November 1986, and a strong protest was lodged with him over this unprovoked attack.
