Letter dated 2 December 1986 from the Permanent Representative of  
Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter dated 26 November 1986 (A/41/918-S/18489), I have the honour to inform you that the Government of Pakistan has rejected as baseless the allegation made by the Kabul authorities that, on 19 November 1986, 17 rounds of artillery were fired at an Afghan border post in Jaji Woleswali, Paktia province, from the Pakistan side of the border. Pakistan's rejection of the allegation was conveyed to the Afghan Chargé d'affaires on 2 December 1986.
