LETTER DATED 16 SEPTEMBER 1991 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF IRAQ TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

On instructions from my Government, I have the honour to inform you that United States aircraft continue to violate Iraqi airspace, as follows:

I

- American air activity inside Iraqi airspace on 11/12 September 1991 amounted to 12 sorties flown by six two-aircraft formations at speeds of 650 to 750 kilometres per hour and at altitudes ranging from 2,000 to 7,000 metres.
- 2. The air activity centred over Dohuk, Arbil, Mosul, Amadiyah, Ayn Zalah, Tall 'Afar and Rawanduz, for the purpose of observation and provocation.
- 3. At 1700 hours on the same day, two F-16 aircraft flew at altitudes of 100 to 400 metres and at a speed of 700 kilometres per hour over the Tall 'Afar airfield.

II

- 1. United States aircraft continued to violate Iraqi airspace on 12/13 September 1991, for the purpose of observation and provocation. They carried out 22 sorties flown by six two-aircraft formations, one three-aircraft formation and seven single aircraft, at speeds of 600 to 800 kilometres per hour and at altitudes ranging from 4,000 to 7,000 metres.
- The American air activity centred over Dohuk, Mosul, Arbil, Tall 'Afar, Rawanduz, Zakho and Amadiyah.

III

1. At 1755 hours on 12/13 September 1991 a four-aircraft formation violated our international frontier from the direction of Kuwait, penetrating between 5 and 7 kilometres south of the Artawi airfield.

- 2. American air activity inside Iraqi airspace on 13/14 September 1991 amounted to 29 sorties flown by 12 two-aircraft formations and five single aircraft at speeds of 600 to 850 kilometres per hour and at altitudes ranging from 3,500 to 7,500 metres.
- 3. The air activity centred over Zakho, Amadiyah, Arbil, Mosul, Dohuk and Tall 'Afar, for the purpose of observation and provocation.
- 4. Iraqi airspace was violated to a depth of between 25 and 30 kilometres by four aircraft two single aircraft and one two-aircraft formation entering from Saudi airspace at speeds of 500 to 720 kilometres per hour.
- 5. At 2150 hours six helicopters were observed hovering north of Sadd al-Mawsil.

I should be grateful if you would have this letter circulated as a document of the Security Council.
