Composition of the Secretariat Report of the Secretary-General

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I. INTRODUCTION

1. The annual report of the Secretary-General on the composition of the Secretariat is submitted in accordance with a number of resolutions of the General Assembly, the most recent of which are resolutions 43/224 A of 21 December 1988, 44/185 A of 19 December 1989 and 45/239 A of 21 December 1990. The purpose of the report is to facilitate an assessment of the distribution of the staff of the United Nations Secretariat by nationality, sex, grade and type of appointment, in the light of the principles contained in the Charter of the United Nations and the guidelines set forth by the General Assembly.

2. This report contains information on the staff as of 30 June 1991, as compared with previous years. This information can be found mainly in the statistical tables inserted throughout the report, as well as in those contained in annex I to the report. In addition, detailed information on the staff can be found in the List of Staff of the United Nations Secretariat (A/C.5/46/L.2). Information concerning women at the United Nations can also be found in the current report of the Secretary-General on the improvement of the status of women at the United Nations Secretariat (A/46/377). A number of statistical tables contained in the present report are also reproduced in that report to facilitate the consideration of the question of women on the basis of a single comprehensive report in accordance with the views of Member States as expressed during the deliberations on the subject in the Third and Fifth Committees.

II. COMPOSITION OF THE SECRETARIAT

A. Staff of the United Nations

3. The power of the Secretary-General to appoint staff derives from Article 101, paragraph 1, of the Charter of the United Nations, which reads:

"The staff shall be appointed by the Secretary-General under regulations established by the General Assembly".

4. Aside from the power of appointment of the Secretary-General, a number of United Nations subsidiary organs enjoy a special status granted by the General Assembly concerning the appointment of their staff. These subsidiary organs are the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP); the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR); the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF); the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR); the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA); the International Trade Centre (ITC); the secretariat of the International Civil Service Commission (ICSC); the United Nations University (UNU); and the Registry of the International Court of Justice (ICJ).

Total staff of the United Nations

5. The total number of staff of the United Nations is 29,246, of whom 13,973 are assigned to the Secretariat of the United Nations and 15,273 to the secretariats of United Nations subsidiary organs (see para. above). As regards the funding, 10,248 staff occupy posts financed from the regular budget and 18,998 staff are in posts financed from extrabudgetary sources. Further details about the composition of the staff, source of funds, category and related information, can be found in table A below. These data are also illustrated in figures 1 to 3.

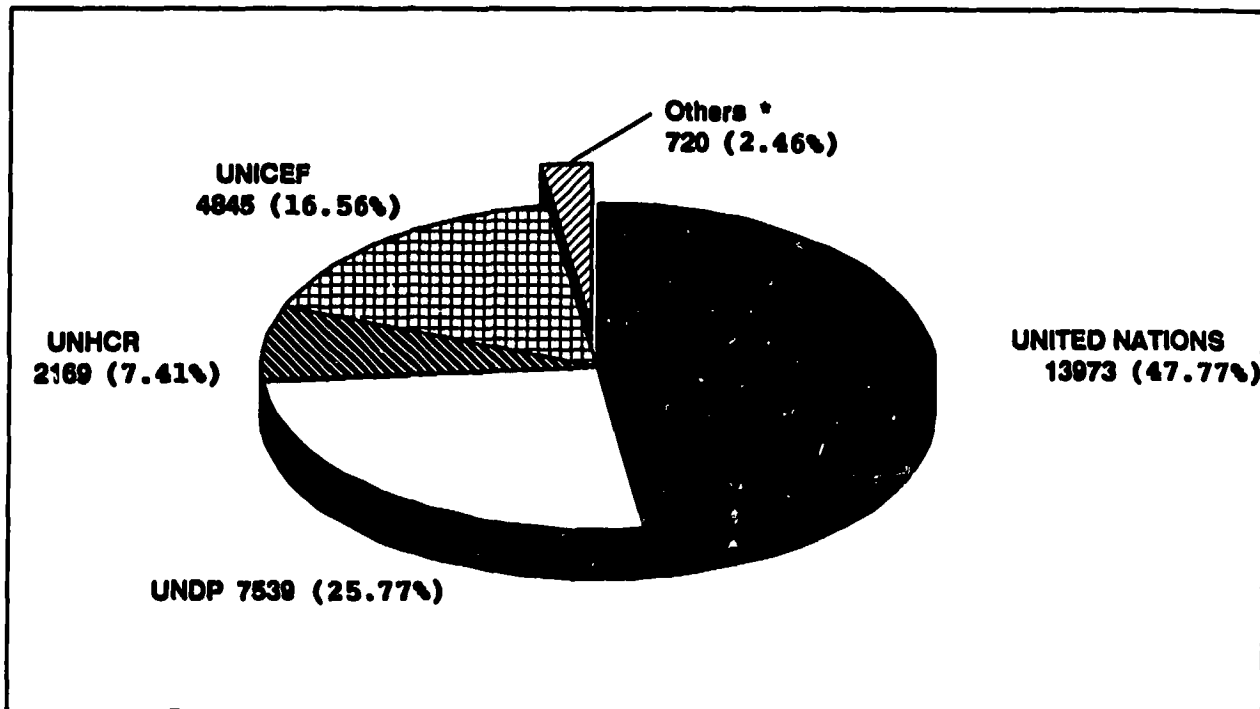

(29,246 staff)

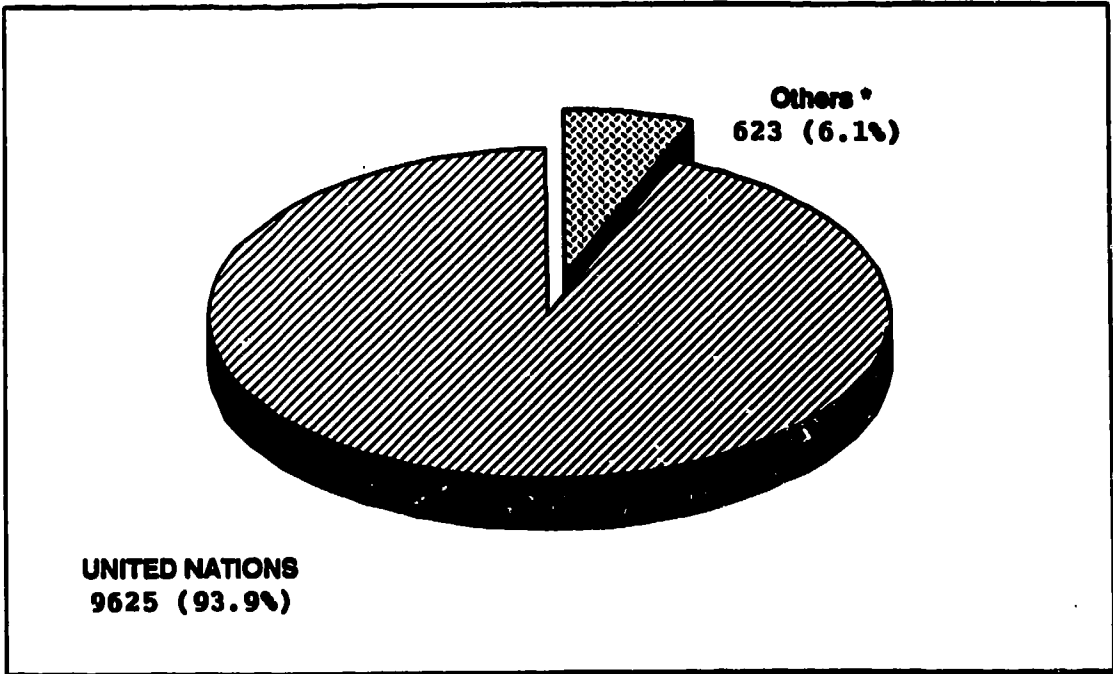

(10,248 staff)

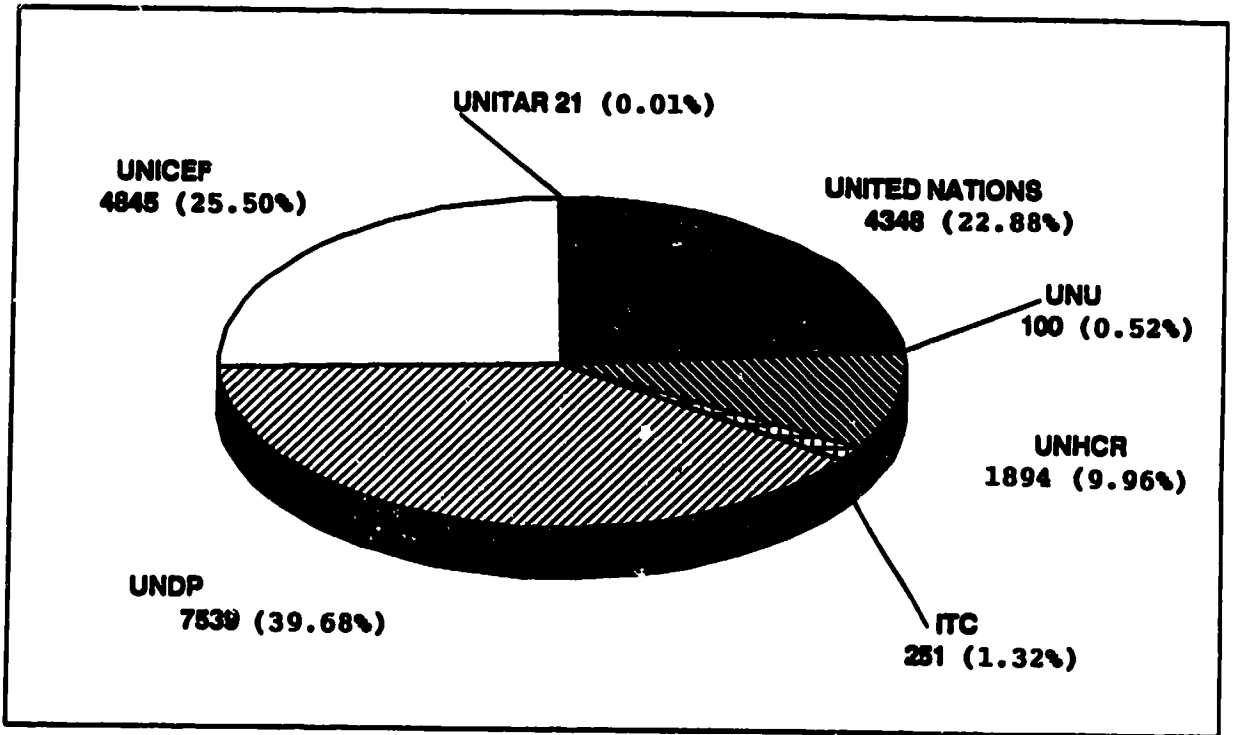

Principles governing the recruitment and employment of staff

6. The principles governing the recruitment and employment of staff are derived from Article 101, paragraph 3, of the Charter. This Article reads:

"The paramount consideration in the employment of the staff and in the determination of the conditions of service shall be the necessity of securing the highest standards of efficiency, competence, and integrity. Due regard shall be paid to the importance of recruiting the staff on as wide a geographical basis as possible."

7. These principles apply to all the staff of the United Nations, including the staff of the secretariats of United Nations subsidiary organs with a special status in matters of appointment (see para. 4 above).

B. Posts subject to geographical distribution

8. A particular group of staff of the United Nations Secretariat are covered by a system of desirable ranges used as a guideline for estimating the comparative representation of the nationals of each Member State. This system has been established by the General Assembly on the basis of three factors: membership, contribution and population. The staff concerned are referred to as "staff in posts subject to geographical distribution". The special characteristic of this group of staff, who currently number 2,600, is that they are directly appointed by the Secretary-General for at least one year to posts in the Professional category and above.

Staff excluded from geographical distribution

9. There are a number of staff members who are excluded from geographical distribution. The largest group is composed of staff who do not serve in the United Nations Secretariat but in the secretariats of United Nations subsidiary organs with special status in matters of appointment (see para. 4 above).

10. Within the Secretariat, the largest groups excluded are staff in posts with special language requirements and staff in the Field Service and the General Service and related categories, namely, Trades and Crafts, Security and Safety and Public Information Assistants. Other groups consist of staff specifically appointed for mission service; staff appointed for service limited to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) or to the United Nations Centre on Human Settlements (UNCHS); staff appointed after inter-agency consultation to posts financed on an inter-agency basis; technical cooperation project personnel; and National Officers serving at United Nations Information Centres.

11. Also excluded are staff with appointments for less than one year; staff on special leave without pay; staff on secondment to other agencies; and staff members who are permanent residents in the country of their duty station.

Information on the numbers of these groups of staff can be found in table 1 in annex I.

12. It is important to note that the source of financing of a post (regular budget or extrabudgetary funds) does not of itself determine whether a post is subject to geographical distribution. Whereas many regular-budget posts are excluded from geographical distribution (such as language posts and others), extrabudgetary posts are subject to geographical distribution unless expressly excluded for the reasons given in paragraphs 9 to 11 above.

13. Additional information on the application of the principle of equitable geographical distribution can be found in the report of the Secretary-General on options for desirable ranges.

C. Representation of Member States

14. The representation of Member States is assessed in conformity with the system of desirable ranges (see annex I, table 4). Member States fall into four categories, resulting from the comparison of their ranges with the number of their nationals in posts subject to geographical distribution. These categories are: unrepresented; underrepresented; within-range; and overrepresented. 1/

15. On 30 June 1991, there were 9 unrepresented Member States, as compared with 11 on 1 July 1990, the beginning of the reporting year. Djibouti, Dominica and Mozambique, which were unrepresented, are now underrepresented. A newly admitted Member State, Liechtenstein, is unrepresented. The Member States unrepresented on 30 June 1991 accordingly were: Albania, Bahrain, Brunei Darussalam, Kuwait, Liechtenstein, Maldives, Sao Tome and Principe, Solomon Islands and Vanuatu.

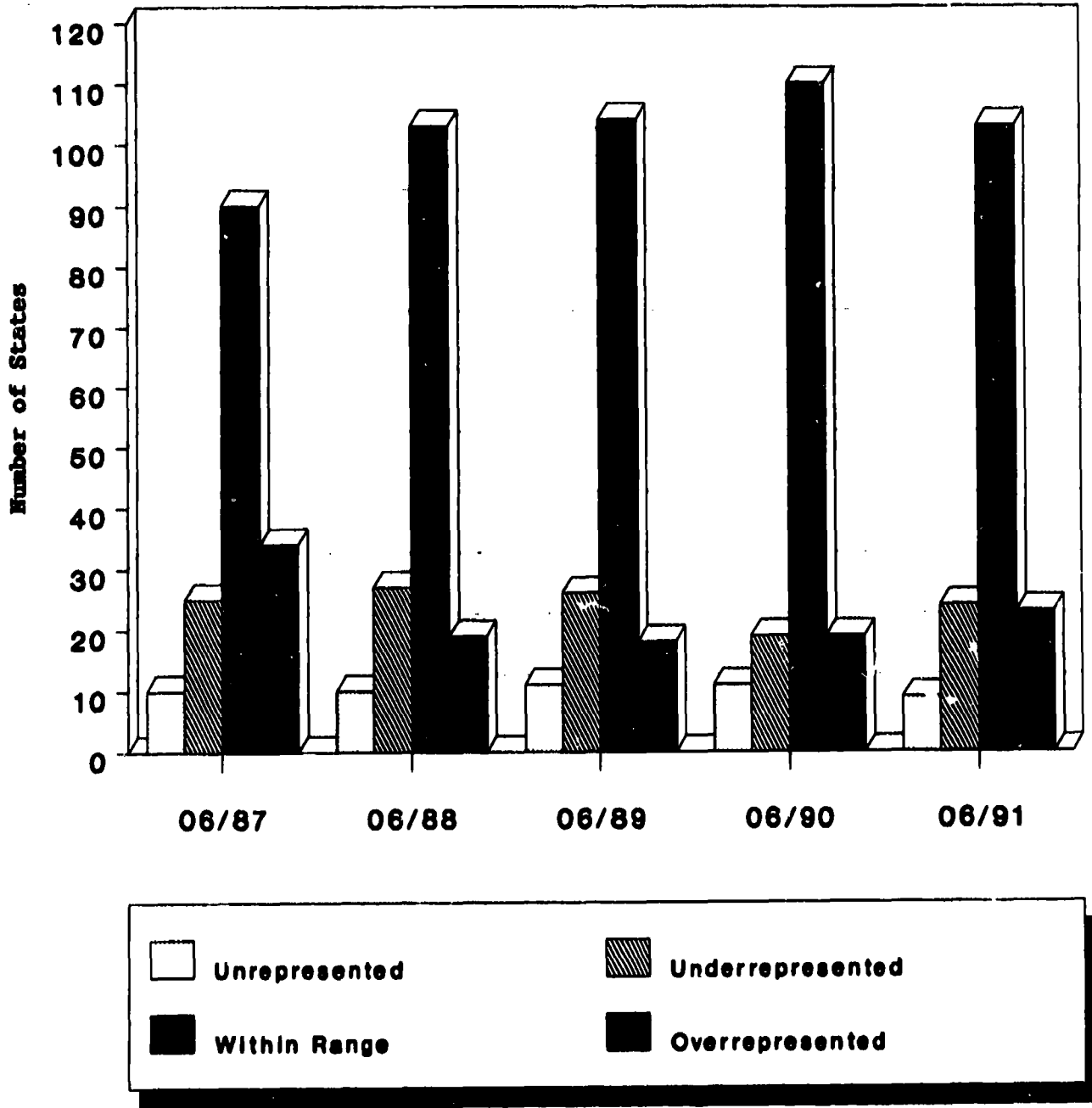
16. On 30 June 1991, there were 24 underrepresented Member States, as compared with 19 on 1 July 1990. They were: Angola, the Bahamas, Botswana, Cape Verde, Djibouti, Dominica, Germany, Guinea-Bissau, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Mongolia, Mozambique, Paraguay, Portugal, Qatar, Romania, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Saudi Arabia, Spain, the United Arab Emirates and Viet Nam. China, which was underrepresented, is now within range. Botswana, Saint Kitts and Nevis and Spain, which were within range, are now underrepresented. On 1 July 1990, the Federal Republic of Germany was within range and the German Democratic Republic was underrepresented. On 3 October 1990, the accession of the German Democratic Republic to the Federal Republic of Germany took place. Germany is currently underrepresented.

17. The changes in the representation of Member States may result not only from the appointments and separations from service of staff but also from such other factors as the adjustments of the desirable ranges resulting from an increase or decrease in the number of posts subject to geographical distribution and from variations in the assessed contribution of individual

Member States or in their population, as well as from changes in the status of some staff members (consequent upon such actions as movements between geographic and non-geographic posts, departures on secondment or special leave without pay, returns from secondment or special leave and changes of nationality).

18. The evolution in the comparative representation of Member States in geographic posts over the period from 30 June 1987 to 30 June 1991 is illustrated in figure 4 below.

D. Groupings of Member States

19. In resolution 45/239 A, the General Assembly recognized that matters related to the representation of Member States in the Secretariat were dealt with on a country basis and requested the Secretary-General to include in future reports on the composition of the Secretariat statistical tables broken down by the current groupings of Member States as well as tables in alphabetical order and to continue to produce tables showing the representation of developing and other countries in posts subject to geographical distribution.

20. In conformity with the Assembly's request, the tables contained in annex I to the report are arranged first by country, in alphabetical order, and then by major geographical region. The composition of each region is shown in section A of annex II to the present report. Table B below shows the number of Member States in each geographical region arranged by degree of representation during the period 1987-1991.

21. Information concerning the representation of developing and other countries is shown in table C below, which shows the situation each year during the five-year period 1987-1991. In accordance with past practice, ad hoc desirable ranges for developing countries and other countries have been established by totalling the desirable ranges of all countries in each group.

22. The first column of table C indicates the group and the second the year. The third and fourth columns show the combined desirable ranges and midpoint for each group. The fifth column shows the percentage of posts corresponding to the midpoint of each group. The remaining columns show the actual numbers and the percentage of posts encumbered by nationals of countries members of the group at various levels: all staff in the Professional category and above, staff at the D-1 level and above, staff at the D-2 level and above and staff at the ASG level and above. In estimating the representation of each group, due account is taken of the actual percentage of posts encumbered by nationals of countries in the group as compared with the percentage established by reference to the midpoint of the group's ad hoc desirable range.

23. In view of the concerns of the General Assembly relating to the representation of women in senior posts, attention is also drawn to the figures between parentheses, which show the situation of women.

E. Staff at the senior levels - Principal Officer (D-1) and above

Representation of developing and other countries

24. In resolution 45/239 A, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to take every available measure to ensure, at the senior and policy formulating levels of the Secretariat, the equitable representation of Member States, in particular of developing countries and Member States with inadequate representation at those levels, in accordance with the relevant resolutions of the General Assembly, and to include relevant information in future reports on the composition of the Secretariat.

25. The action taken by the Secretary-General in this regard during the period 1987-1991 is reflected in table C above. The representation of developing countries and other countries at the senior and policy-making levels is shown in several columns on the righthand side of the table. More detailed information on the representation of Member States at these and other levels can be found in table 4 in annex I to this report.

Representation in the upper echelons - Assistant Secretary-General, Under-Secretary-General and Director-General

26. In resolution 45/239 A, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General, in order to preserve the principles of equitable geographical distribution and rotation in the upper echelons of the Secretariat - Assistant Secretary-General, Under-Secretary-General and Director-General - to ensure that equal opportunity is given to candidates of all Member States when making appointments to all posts in the upper echelons.

27. During the period under review, six changes have taken place in the upper echelons of the Secretariat. Nationals of China, Ghana, Haiti, Peru, Senegal, and Sierra Leone were appointed or reassigned to positions previously encumbered by nationals of, respectively China, Argentina, Peru, Sierra Leone, Ghana and Somalia. A national of India was appointed to a newly created temporary position.

F. Representation of women

28. At its forty-fifth session, the General Assembly adopted two resolutions on the improvement of the status of women in the Secretariat: resolutions 45/125 of 14 December 1990 and 45/239 C of 21 December 1990. Resolution 45/125 was adopted on the report of the Third Committee and 45/239 C on the report of the Fifth Committee.

29. In resolution 45/239 C, the General Assembly urged the Secretary-General to continue his efforts to increase the number of women in posts subject to geographical distribution, in particular in senior policy-level and decision-making posts, in order to achieve an overall participation rate of

30 per cent by the end of 1990 and, to the extent possible to 35 per cent by 1995, taking into account the principle that the paramount consideration shall be the necessity of securing the highest standards of efficiency, competence and integrity with full respect for the principle of equitable geographical distribution.

30. In the same resolution, the General Assembly also urged the Secretary-General, all things being equal and to the extent possible, to accord priority to the participation of women at the D-1 level and above, with a view to increasing the participation rate of women in posts at the D-1 level and above to 25 per cent of the total within the overall participation rate of women in 35 per cent of posts subject to geographical distribution by 1995.

31. Also in the same resolution, the General Assembly reiterated its request that the Secretary-General make every effort to increase the representation of women from developing countries, in particular at the D-1 level and above.

32. Resolution 45/125 contains analogous provisions. In particular, in paragraph 1 of the resolution, the General Assembly urged the Secretary-General to continue, in accordance with the Charter of the United Nations, all possible efforts to increase the number of women employed throughout the United Nations system, particularly in senior policy-level and decision-making posts, and particularly from the developing countries in view of the small proportion of women from those countries in such posts, in order to achieve an overall participation rate of 30 per cent by the end of 1990 and 35 per cent by 1995, with due regard to equitable geographical distribution, in accordance with the report of the Secretary-General of 8 November 1985 (A/C.5/40/30), all relevant subsequent resolutions and the proposed medium-term plan for the period 1992-1997. 2/

33. The efforts to meet the requests of the General Assembly concerning women continue. As at 30 June 1991, the number of women in geographic posts was 759, or 29.2 per cent. Table 3 A of annex I shows the distribution of men and women by region and level.

34. The evolution of the proportion of women in geographic posts between 30 June 1987, when it was 25.67 per cent, and 30 June 1991 is shown in table D below. This table also shows women staff for each region as percentages of all staff (table D1) and as percentages of women staff only (table D2). These data are also illustrated in figures 5 and 6 below.

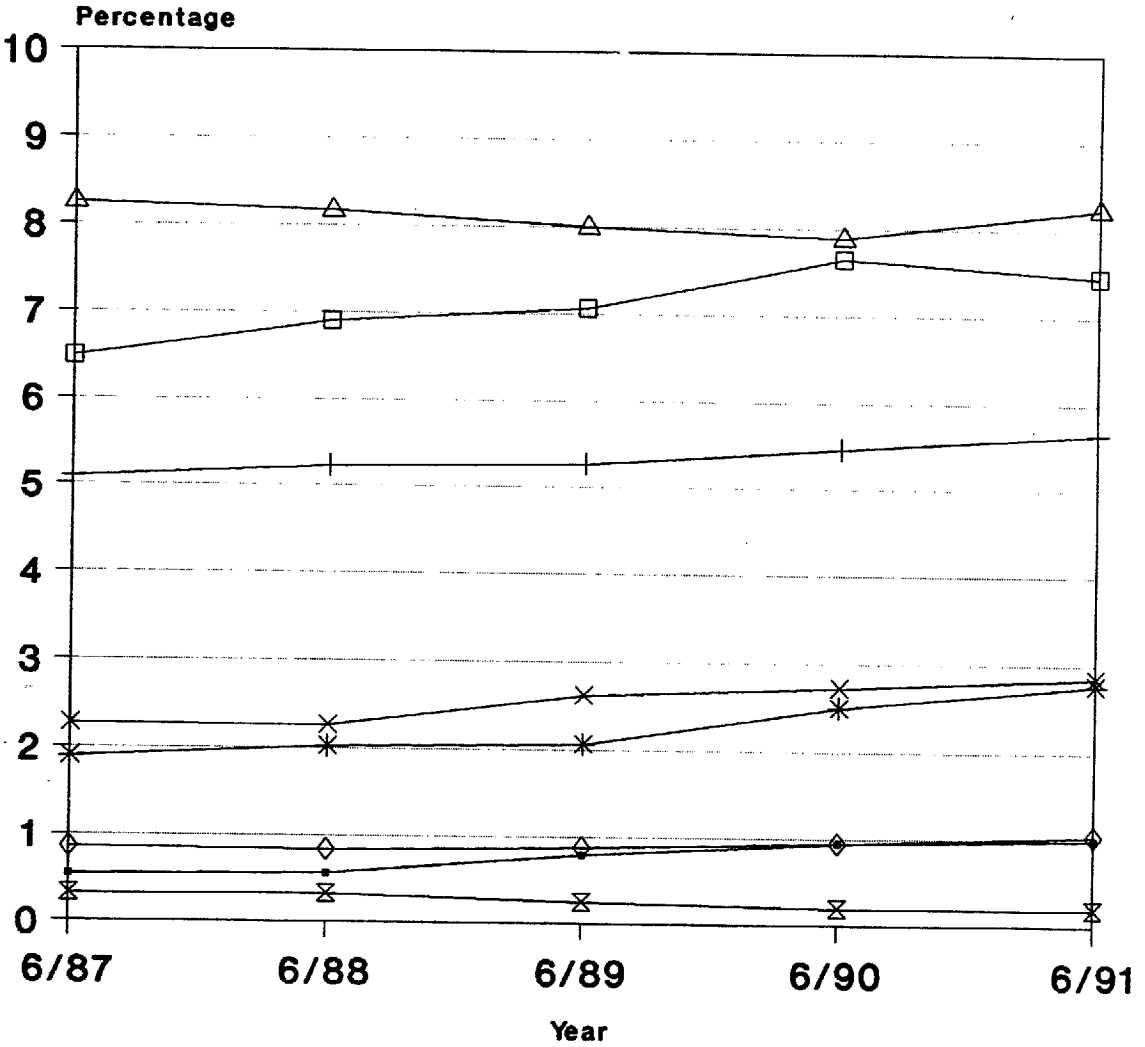

(June 1987-June 1991)

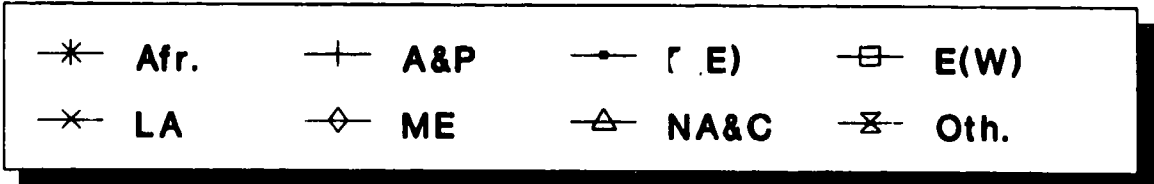
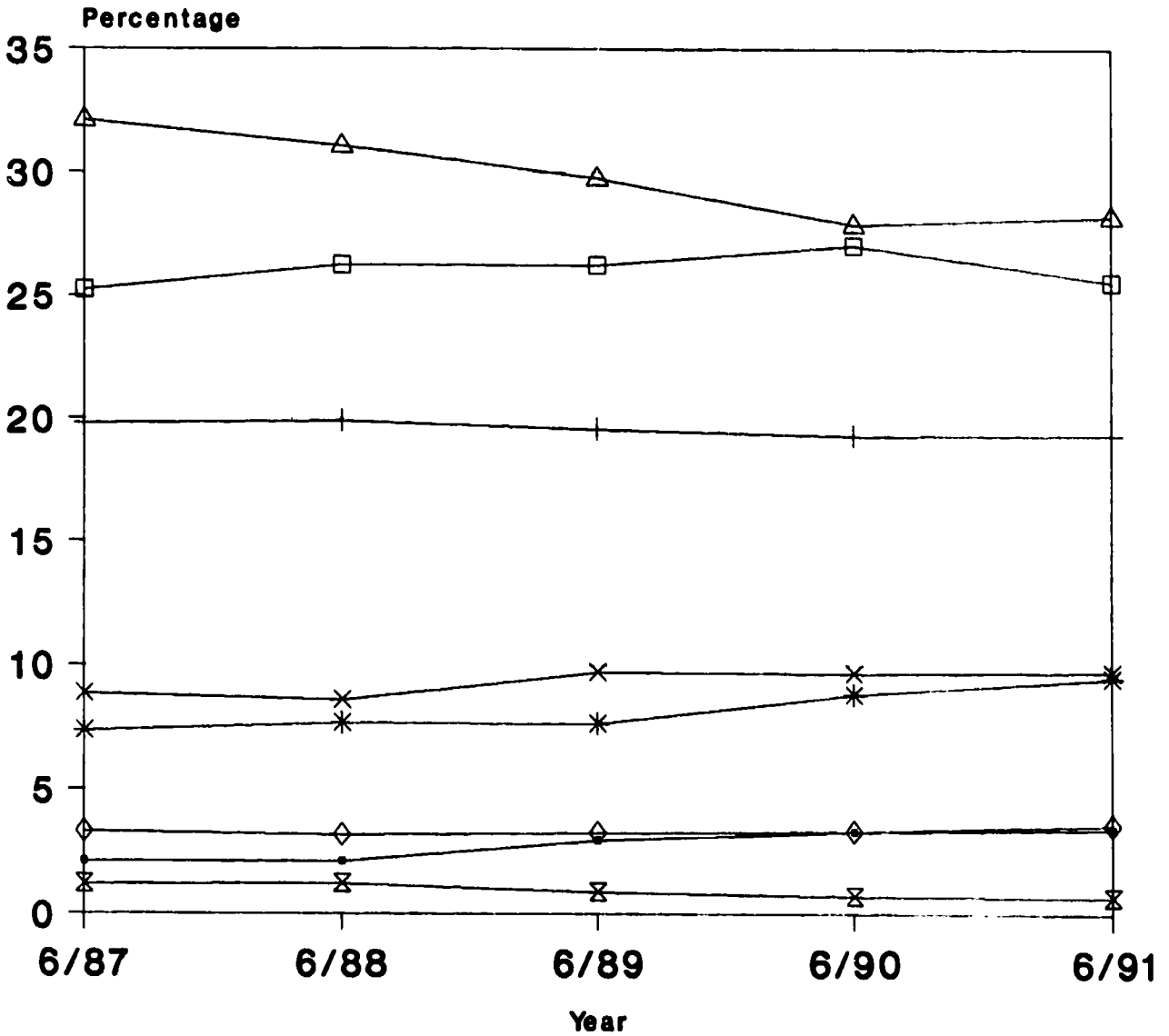

35. The number and percentage of women in geographic posts and in posts with special language requirements on 30 June 1981 and on 30 June 1991 is shown in cable E below. The percentage of women in geographic posts has risen from 21.6 per cent to 29.2 per cent over this period. The percentage of women in language posts has moved from 32.8 per cent to 33.8 per cent over the same period. Figure 7 below shows how the percentage of women in geographic posts has increased between 1981 and 1991.

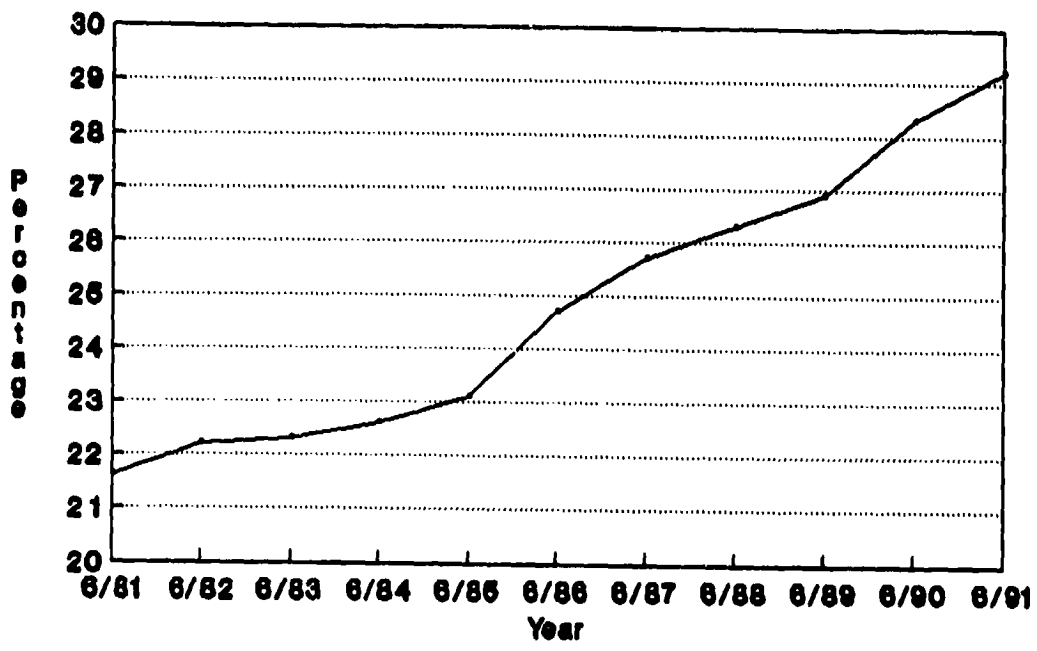

36. The distribution of men and women within each organizational element of the Secretariat is shown in table 22 of annex I. This table gives the information separately for geographic posts, language posts and posts in the General Service and related categories.

37. In resolution 37/235 B, the General Assembly also called upon the Secretary-General to include in the present report statistical analyses on the number and percentage of women by nationality on all appointment lists, specifying women as a percentage of those appointed from outside, within each grade. The number, sex, nationality and level of the staff appointed to geographic posts during the reporting period are shown in table 6 of annex I. Information on the appointment of men and women is also contained in table F below.

38. Additional information on the representation of women can be found in the report of the Secretary-General on the Improvement of the Status of Women in the United Nations Secretariat (A/46/377).

G. Recruitment activities

**Appointments to posts subject to geographical distribution
during the period 1 July 1990 to 30 June 1991**

39. In resolution 45/239 A, the General Assembly urged the Secretary-General, whenever making appointments at all levels to posts subject to geographical distribution, to make every effort to recruit nationals of unrepresented and underrepresented Member States, bearing in mind also the need to increase the number of staff recruited from Member States below the mid-point of their desirable ranges.

40. During the reporting period, 1 July 1990 to 30 June 1991, 170 appointments were made to posts subject to geographical distribution. 3/ Of these 170 appointments, 1, or 0.59 per cent, was of a national of an unrepresented Member State; 27, or 15.88 per cent, were of nationals of underrepresented Member States; 129, or 75.88 per cent, were of nationals of within-range Member States; 11, or 6.47 per cent, were of nationals of overrepresented Member States and 2, or 1.18 per cent, were of nationals of non-member States. 4/ Further details on the number and levels of these appointments can be found in paragraphs 42 to 46 below and in table 6 of annex I of the present report. 5/

National competitive examinations

41. Appointments to posts subject to geographical distribution during the reporting period included those of 29 candidates who were successful in national competitive examinations for posts at the P-1 and P-2 levels. They were selected through examinations held in Australia, Denmark, Germany, Hungary, Indonesia, Israel, Japan, Netherlands, Norway, Panama, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and Yugoslavia.

42. These appointments account for 17.06 per cent of all appointments to posts subject to geographical distribution during the reporting period. They included 10 women, representing 34.5 per cent of these appointments.

43. Nineteen candidates (13 women and 6 men) were recruited at the P-1 and P-2 levels outside the context of national competitive examinations.

44. Competitive examinations for posts at the P-1 and P-2 levels were also held in Bahrain, Iceland, New Zealand and Portugal. A number of successful candidates in these examinations are also currently under recruitment.

45. National competitive examinations for posts at the P-1 and P-2 levels are currently under way for nationals of Albania, Bahrain, Costa Rica, Czechoslovakia, Dominica, Grenada, Honduras, Italy, Japan, Nicaragua, Saudi Arabia and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines.

46. On a trial basis, competitive examinations for posts at the P-3 level in the occupational groups of Administration and Economics are currently taking place for candidates from Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Italy and Japan. These examinations are covered by a separate report.

Organizational units with high vacancy rates

47. In conformity with the requests of the Assembly in resolutions 43/224 A and 45/239 A, the Secretary-General gives special attention to the filling of posts in organizational units with high vacancy rates, particularly the regional commissions. Of the 170 appointments made during the reporting period, 57 or 33.53 per cent, were to posts in the regional commissions (18 to ECA, 8 to ECE, 10 to ECLAC, 18 to ESCAP, and 3 to ESCWA).

48. In resolution 45/239 A, the General Assembly also requested the Secretary-General, with respect to the recruitment, transfer and promotion of staff for placement in the regional commissions, to make every effort to encourage equitable representation of all Member States in the regional commissions, in order to reduce the high vacancy rates. Information on the representation of all regions in the regional commissions is shown in table 2 of annex 1.

Recruitment of women

49. Between 1 July 1990 and 30 June 1991, 57 women were appointed to posts subject to geographical distribution, representing 33.5 per cent of the 170 appointments made during the reporting period, as compared with 63 or 31.2 per cent, of the 202 appointments made during the previous reporting period. Women from developing countries accounted for 25 appointments, that is to say, 43.9 per cent of the 57 appointments of women made during the reporting period.

4/ The figures cited in this paragraph are computed on the basis of the degree of representation of each Member State at the end of the previous reporting year, on 30 June 1990, as communicated to the General Assembly in the latest report of the Secretary-General on the composition of the Secretariat (A/45/541). Although the fluctuations in the representation of Member States during the reporting year are not directly taken into account in this computation, they are estimated monthly and used in monitoring geographical distribution and in planning recruitment.

5/ As noted in paragraph 16, on 30 June 1990, the Federal Republic of Germany was within range and the German Democratic Republic was underrepresented. Upon the accession of the German Democratic Republic to the Federal Republic of Germany on 3 October 1990, Germany became underrepresented. The appointments of German nationals for the current reporting period (1990-1991) are accordingly considered as appointments of nationals of an underrepresented Member State.
