Report of the Fifth Committee

- 1. At its 36th and 37th meetings, on 25 May and 2 June 2017, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement submitted by the Secretary-General on the programme budget implications of draft resolution A/71/L.66 (A/C.5/71/22). At the 36th meeting, the Vice-Chair of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions introduced the related report of that Committee (A/71/912). The draft decision submitted by the Chair following informal consultations coordinated by the representative of Kenya (A/C.5/71/L.32) was before the Committee (see para. 3).
- 2. The statements and comments made in the course of the Fifth Committee's consideration of this question are reflected in the relevant summary records. ¹

Decision of the Fifth Committee

- 3. The Fifth Committee, having considered the statement of programme budget implications submitted by the Secretary-General² and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions:³
- (a) Decides to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/71/L.66, additional resource requirements in the amount of \$373,200 net of staff assessment, comprising \$162,700 under section 3, Political affairs, and \$210,500 under section 29D, Office of Central Support Services, would be met from within sections 3 and 29D, respectively, of the programme budget for the biennium 2016-2017;
- (b) Also decides to establish two posts (1 Under-Secretary-General and 1 P-3) under section 3, Political affairs, of the programme budget for the biennium 2016-2017.
