IMPLEMENTATION OF GENERAL ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 2830 (XXVI)  
CONCERNING THE SIGNATURE AND RATIFICATION OF ADDITIONAL  
PROTOCOL II OF THE TREATY FOR THE PROHIBITION OF NUCLEAR  
WEAPONS IN LATIN AMERICA (TREATY OF TLATELOLCO)

Report of the Secretary-General

1. General Assembly resolution 2830 (XXVI) of 16 December 1971, urged those nuclear-weapon States which had not yet signed and ratified Additional Protocol II of the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America (Treaty of Tlatelolco) to do so without further delay, and requested the Secretary-General to transmit the resolution to the nuclear-weapon States and to inform the General Assembly at its twenty-seventh session of any measure adopted by them in order to implement it.
2. Pursuant to this decision, the Secretary-General, by his letter of 8 February 1972, transmitted the text of resolution 2830 (XXVI) to the nuclear-weapon States, and requested them to inform him of any measure taken in regard to its implementation.
3. The Secretary-General has received a reply only from the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics. The substantive part of this reply is as follows:

"... the position of the Soviet Union concerning the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America has been made known to the United Nations on numerous occasions. It was set forth, inter alia, in a letter of 28 June 1971 addressed to the Secretary-General by the Permanent Representative of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics to the United Nations, transmitting the reply of the Supreme Soviet of the USSR to the Senate of the United Mexican States, 1/ and in a statement made in the First Committee by the representative of the USSR at the twenty-fifth session of the General Assembly." 2/
