THE POLICIES OF APARTHEID OF THE GOVERNMENT OF SOUTH AFRICA

Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. At the 1933rd plenary meeting, on 17 December 1970, the President of the General Assembly appointed four of the seven additional members which it had been decided, in resolution 2671 A (XXV) of 8 December 1970, to add to the Special Committee on Apartheid. On that occasion, the President informed the Members of the General Assembly that, in his view, two of the seats still to be filled should be allocated to the group of Western European and other States and the third should be allocated to the group of Latin American States.
- 2. In a letter dated 14 January 1971, the Permanent Representative of Brazil to the United Nations, acting in his capacity as Chairman of the Latin American group, informed the President of the twenty-fifth session of the General Assembly that the group had unanimously decided to nominate Guatemala.
- 3. The President of the twenty-fifth session of the General Assembly therefore informed the Secretary-General that, in pursuance of paragraph 4 of resolution 2671 A (XXV), he had appointed Guatemala to serve on the Special Committee on Apartheid.
- 4. The membership of the Special Committee will henceforth be as follows: Algeria, Ghana, Guatemala, Guinea, Haiti, Hungary, India, Malaysia, Nepal, Nigeria, Philippines, Somalia, Sudan, Syria, Trinidad and Tobago, and the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic.
