Note by the Secretary-General

In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 1931 for limiting the Manufacture and regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to forward to the Members of the United Nations and to the other parties to the Convention the following law communicated by the Government of Belgium.

ORDINANCE NO. 168/HYG. OF 29 MAY 1947

AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 27/BIS HYG. OF 15 MARCH 1933 ON THE PRACTICE OF PHARMACY, THE TRAFFIC IN POISONOUS, SOPORIFIC, NARCOTIC, DISINFECTANT OR ANTISEPTIC SUBSTANCES, SERUMS, VACCINES AND BIOLOGICAL PREPARATIONS AND THE CULTIVATION OF PLANTS FOR PHARMACEUTICAL USE

Representing the Governor General

Considering the law on the Government-General of the Belgian Congo;

Considering the Royal Decree of 29 June 1933 on the administrative organization of the Colony, and in particular sections 17 and 19 thereof;

Considering the Decree of 23 December 1924, and in particular sections 7, 8, 9 and 10 thereof;

Revising Ordinance No. 27/bis Hyg. of 15 March 1933 on the practice of pharmacy, the traffic in poisonous, soporific, narcotic, disinfectant or antiseptic substances, serums, vaccines and biological preparations and the cultivation of plants for pharmaceutical use,

DECREES

Section 1 - Section 36 of the Ordinance of 15 March 1933, No. 27/bis Hyg., is rescinded.

Section 2 - The arrangement laid down in section 37 of Ordinance No. 27/bis Hyg. of 15 March 1933 is replaced by the following:

The customs offices open for the importation, exportation and storage of narcotic drugs are those of Matadi, Leopoldville, Costermansville, Elisabethville, Stanleyville and Usumbura.

The authorization shall indicate the customs office or offices through which the narcotic drugs may be imported.
