THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA CUSTOMS (PROHIBITED IMPORTS) REGULATIONS

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations.
- Citation.
- 2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of January, 1935.
- Commencement.
- 3. The importation of the goods specified in the First Schedule* to these Regulations shall be prohibited.
- 4. The importation of the goods specified in the Second Schedule* to these Regulations shall be prohibited unless the consent in writing of the Minister to the importation of the goods has first been obtained.
- 5. The importation of the goods specified in the Third Schedule* to these Regulations shall be prohibited unless the conditions and restrictions respectively specified in that Schedule
