LAWS AND REGULATIONS

PROMULGATED TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONVENTION OF 13 JULY 1931 FOR LIMITING THE MANUFACTURE AND REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS, AS AMENDED BY THE PROTOCOL OF 11 DECEMBER 1946

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL-- In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

CIRCULAR

ON

PHARMACISTS' RECORDS OF THE CONSUMPTION OF NARCOTIC SUBSTANCES

1. In pursuance of article 41 of the Pharmacies Act (No.209 of 11 June 1954), the Board of Health hereby appoints that, from 1 January 1960, pharmacists shall keep a record of their consumption of narcotic substances.
2. A special register shall be kept at pharmacies of the consumption of narcotic substances mentioned in section 5, paragraph 1, of Board of Health circular of 1 December 1956^{1/} on the prescription and supply of medicaments, and Board of Health circular of 23 July 1954, regarding narcotic substances and preparations thereof, prescriptions for which have to be recorded.
3. In the said register, for which a card index or loose-leaf book or such like may be used, every substance or preparation thereof, and every proprietary medicine, shall be entered on a separate card (or loose-leaf).
4. The quantity of narcotic substances contained in preparations need not be entered.
5. The books should show how much is used in the dispensary for making up galenical preparations, and which substances in which preparations.
6. Stock shall be taken at least every quarter, and the consumption of particular substances or preparations in the immediately preceding quarter shall be calculated. Quarterly consumption figures shall be entered on the cards (loose-leaves), and annual consumption shall be noted at the beginning of the year.
7. Full cards or loose-leaves shall be retained by pharmacies for two years.
