NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL -- In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ORDINANCE, 1952 (No. 30 of 1952)

THE DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS, 1952 (L.N. 555/1952)

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by subparagraph (a) of paragraph (1) of Regulation 3 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1952, the High Commissioner in Council hereby authorises the Assistant Comptroller of Customs, Negri Sembilan and Malacca, to cultivate the plant Cannabis Sativa for the purpose of instructing Inspectors, officers of customs and police officers in the recognition of Indian hemp, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) that cultivation shall be at No. 630, Jalan Dato Klana, Seremban, and the Customs Training School, Malacca, only;
- (2) the Assistant Comptroller shall take measures to safeguard his possession of the plants;
- (3) that the Assistant Comptroller shall make provision for the destruction of any such plant cultivated by virtue of this authority or Indian hemp obtained therefrom which is surplus to requirements for instructional purposes;
- (4) that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to authorise the consumption of Indian hemp by any person; and
- (5) that this authority shall expire on the 31st day of December, 1955.
