In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

MINISTRY OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND POPULATION

Modifications of Part II of the Schedules of Poisonoùs
Substances

The Minister of Public Health and Population,

Considering the Act of 19 July 1845, as amended and supplemented by the Acts of 12 July 1916 and 20 December 1933 and the Decree of 29 July 1939 on Poisonous Substances;

Considering the Decree of 19 November 1948, and in particular the last paragraph of Article 1 of that Decree which reads as follows:

"Poisonous substances intended for medical purposes are listed in Part II of Schedules A, B and C by order of the Minister of Public Health and Population."

Considering the Orders of 7 December 1948, 16 March 1949 and 20 December 1950, Orders as follows:

Article 1

The following substances shall be included in Schedule B of Poisonous Substances, Part II:

Acetyldihydrocodeine Dihydrocodeine

maryling 3 hydroxy-N-methyl morphinan

Article 7

This Order shall be put into effect by the Chief of the Central Pharmaceutical Office (Service central de la pharmacie).
