PROMULGATED TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONVENTION OF 13 JULY 1931 FOR LIMITING THE MANUFACTURE AND REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS, AS AMENDED BY THE PROTOCOL OF 11 DECEMBER 1946

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL.—In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative texts.

(Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, Cap. 33)

ORDER

4 March 1959

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by subsection (3) of Section 9 of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, the Governor has declared that Part III of the Ordinance shall apply to the drugs specified in the Schedule to this Order in the same manner as the said Part III applies to the drugs mentioned in subsection (1) of Section 9 of the Ordinance.

SCHEDULE

Anileridine 1/ (1-(2-(p-aminophenyl)-ethyl)-4-phenylpiperidine-4-carboxylic acid ethyl ester), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of anileridine;

Etoxeridine (1-(2-(2-hydroxyethoxy)-ethyl)-4-phenylpiperidine-4-carboxylic acid ethyl ester), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract, or other substance containing any proportion of etoxeridine;

Methyldihydromorphine (6-methyldihydromorphine), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of methyldihydromorphine;

1-(3-methyl-4-morpholino-2/2-diphenylbutyryl)-pyrrelidine, /(-)-3-methyl-4-morpholine-2, 2-diphenylbutyrylpyrrolidine er levomoramide/1/, its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any preportion of 1-(3-methyl-4-morpholino-2:2-diphenylbutyryl)-pyrrolidine;

<u>Morpheridine</u> (1-(2-morphelinoethyl)-4-phenylpiperidine-4-carboxylic acid ethyl ester), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of morpheridine;

Myrophine (myristyl ester of benzylmorphine), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract, or other substance containing any proportion of myrophine;

Oxymorphone (dihydro-14-hydroxymorphinone), _ dihydrohydroxymorphinone], its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract, or other substance containing any proportion of oxymorphone;

Trimeperidine (1:2:5-trimethyl-4-phenyl-4-propionyloxy-piperidine), $\sqrt{1}$, 2,5-trimethyl-4-phenyl-4-propionoxypiperidine, its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of trimeperidine;

The esters (other than the ethyl <u>pethidine</u> and isopropyl <u>properidine</u> esters) of l-methyl-4-phenylpiperidine-4-carboxylic acid, their salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of the said esters.

ORDER

4 March 1959

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the proviso to Section 10(1) of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, the Governor hereby orders that the provisions of the said subsection (1) shall cease to apply to the following drugs:

Methyldihydromorphine (6-methyldihydromorphine);

Myrophine (myristyl ester of benzylmorphine);

Oxymorphone (dihydro-14-hydroxymorphinone)

dihydrohydroxymorphinone
