Note by the Secretary-General

In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 1931 for limiting the Manufacture and regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to forward to the Members of the United Nations and to the other parties to the Convention the following law communicated by the Government of the United Kingdom.

ORDER

(Under section 8 (3) of the Ordinance)

THE DANGEROUS DRUGS (AMIDONE AND METHYLDIHYDROMORPHINONE)

ORDER, 1948

IN exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (3) of section 8 of the Ordinance, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to order as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs (Amidone and Methyldihydromorphinone) Order, 1948.

2. Part IV of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance shall apply to:

(i) Amidone (dl-2-dimethylamino-4:4-diphenylheptane-5-one), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of amidone.

(ii) Methyldihydromorphinone (commonly known as Metopon), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of methyldihydromorphinone

Application of Part IV of Cap. 60 to Amidone, Methyldihydromorphinone and preparations, etc., containing any proportion thereof.

in the same manner as the said Part IV applies to the drugs mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 8 of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance.
