THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ORDINANCE (CAP. 60)

THE DANGEROUS DRUGS (EXTENSION OF APPLICATION) ORDER, 1953.*

WHEREAS it appears to the Minister responsible for Health that the drugs specified in the Schedule to this Order are productive, if improperly used, or are capable of being converted into a substance which is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine:

NOW THEREFORE in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Minister responsible for Health by subsection (3) of section 8 of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, the following Order is hereby made:-

Cap. 60.

Title

Part 4 of Cap. 60 to apply to the drugs referred to in the Schedule.

1. This Order may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs (Extension of Application) Order, 1953.

2. Part 4 of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance (which relates to the control of certain manufactured drugs) shall apply to the drugs specified in the Schedule to this Order in the same manner as the said Part 4 applies to the drugs mentioned in subsection (1) of section 8 of the said Ordinance.

SCHEDULE.

"3-Methoxy-N-methylmorphinan (that is to say, dextromethorphan, levomethorphan and racemethorphan) its salts and any preparation admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of 3-methoxy-N-methylmorphinan."

THE PHARMACY AND POISONS ORDINANCE, 1946
(NO. 21 OF 1946)

THE PHARMACY AND POISONS (EXTENSION OF SCHEDULE) ORDER, 1953.

WHEREAS the Pharmacy and Poisons Board has recommended to the Minister responsible for Health that Schedules II and XIII to the Pharmacy and Poisons Ordinance, 1946, should be amended as provided in this Order:

NOW THEREFORE in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Minister by section 79 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Ordinance, 1946, hereinafter called the Ordinance, the following Order is hereby made:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Pharmacy and Poisons (Extension of Schedule) Order, 1953.

2. In Part I of Schedule II of the Ordinance, immediately before the word "Nicotine" there shall be inserted the words and figures contained in the Schedule of this Order.

3. In Schedule XIII of the Ordinance after the words "Tridione, its salts and preparations, whether natural or synthetic" there shall be added the words contained in the Schedule to this Order.

SCHEDULE.

"3-Methoxy-N-methylmorphinan (that is to say, dextromethorphan, levomethorphan and racemethorphan) its salts and any preparation admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of 3-methoxy-N-methylmorphinan."
