PROMULGATED TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONVENTION OF 13 JULY 1931 FOR LIMITING THE MANUFACTURE AND REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS, AS AMENDED BY THE PROTOCOL OF 11 DECEMBER 1946

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL -- In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

LEGISLATIVE MEASURES

"Government Resolution, 28 June 1955: "The Constitutional President of the Republic, whereas it is advisable to take the necessary measures to increase the effectiveness of the control exercised by the Inspectorate of Pharmacies over the sale of narcotic drugs in the pharmacies of the Republic, accordingly RESOLVES: Article 1. To amend the last part of article 116 of the Regulations for the importation, manufacture and preparation, storage and use of and trade in medicinal products and narcotic drugs, approved by Government Resolution, 12 August 1932. The amendment shall be to the effect that pharmacists are required to send to the Inspectorate of Pharmacies of the General Directorate of Public Health originals of the prescriptions dispensed by them in which narcotic drugs are prescribed, retaining copies for use as vouchers. Article 2: This resolution shall come into force on the day of its publication in the Official Journal".
