Note by the Secretary-General

In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 1931 for limiting the Manufacture and regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to forward to the Members of the United Nations and to the other parties to the Convention the following law communicated by the Government of the United Kingdom.

THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ORDINANCE, 1935 (ORDINANCE NO. 35 OF 1935)

Order by the Governor in Council (Under Section 3 (4) of the Ordinance)

1. This Order may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance (Application) Order, 1948.

2. The Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1935, shall apply to the drugs specified in the Schedule to this Order in the same manner as it applies to the drugs mentioned in sub-section (1) of Section 3 of that Ordinance

SCHEDULE

- 1. Amidone (d1-2-dimethylamino-4: 4-diphenyl-heptane-5-one), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of amidone.
- 2. Methyldihydromorphinone (commonly known as metopon), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of methyldihydromorphinone.
