### NOTIFICATION

#### Dangerous Drugs

No. 18

In pursuance of sub-clause (ii) of clause (g) of section 2 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1930 (II of 1930) and the Protocol signed at Paris on the 19th November, 1948, supplementing the earlier Geneva Conventions of 1925, 1931 and 1936 relating to drugs placed under international control, the Central Government hereby declares the narcotic substances specified in this notification to be manufactured drugs, and makes the following further amendment in the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Finance (Department of Revenue) No. 4 - Dangerous Drugs, dated the 4th December, 1956, 1) namely:
