PROMULGATED TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONVENTION OF 13 JULY 1931 FOR LIMITING THE MANUFACTURE AND REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS, AS AMENDED BY THE PROTOCOL OF 11 DECEMBER 1946

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL.—In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative texts.

NOTIFICATION

Dangerous Drugs

No. 18

In pursuance of sub-clause (ii) of clause (g) of section 2 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1930 (II of 1930) and the Protocol signed at Paris on the 19th November, 1948, supplementing the earlier Geneva Conventions of 1925, 1931 and 1936 relating to drugs placed under international control, the Central Government hereby declares the narcotic substances specified in this notification to be manufactured drugs, and makes the following further amendment in the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Finance (Department of Revenue)

No. 4 - Dangerous Drugs, dated the 4th December, 1956, 1) namely:

In the said notification, after item No. (53) the following items shall be added, namely:

Status of the drug under the Conventions

(54) Norcodeine 2) and its salts, all dilutions and preparations containing this drug as have not been established in therapeutic practice.

(55) Normorphine and its salts, and preparations, admixtures, extracts or other substances containing any of these drugs
