LAWS AND REGULATIONS

PROMULGATED TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONVENTION OF 13 JULY 1931 FOR LIMITING THE MANUFACTURE AND REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS, AS AMENDED BY THE PROTOCOL OF 11 DECEMBER 1946

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL-- In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

No objections or suggestions having been received to the draft amendment to the Madras Manufactured Drugs Rules, 1932, under sub-section (2) of section 8 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1930 (Central Act II of 1930), published with the Home Department Notification S.R. No. A-6559 of 1957 at page 560 of the Rules Supplement to Part I of the Fort St. George Gazette, dated 23rd October 1957, the amendment is hereby confirmed.

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 8 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1930 (Central Act II of 1930), the Governor of Madras hereby makes the following amendment to the Madras Manufactured Drugs Rules, 1932, published with Revenue Department Notification No. 203, dated the 29th April 1932, at pages 798 to 806 of Part I of the Fort St. George Gazette, dated the 3rd May 1932, as subsequently amended, the same having been previously published as required by sub-section (1) of section 36 of the said Act.

The amendment hereby made shall be deemed to have come into force on and from the 25th October 1957.

Amendment

In the said rules, for clause (ii) of rule 28, the following clause shall be substituted, namely:-

"(ii) any person in charge of an educational institution or of any institution under the control of a local authority other than a hospital or dispensary or any person engaged in scientific research to possess, import or transport for educational, medicinal or scientific purposes only, manufactured drugs other than prepared opium, in such quantity and in such manner as may be specified by him in that order."
