PROMULGATED TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL TREATIES ON NARCOTIC DRUGS

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL - In accordance with the relevant Articles of the International Treaties on Narcotic Drugs, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative texts.

NOTIFICATION NO. 17 - Dangerous Drugs

New Delhi, 13 November 1965 Kartika 22, 1887 Saka

In pursuance of sub-clause (ii) of clause (g) of section 2 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1930 (2 of 1930) and the Protocol signed at Paris on 19 November, 1948, supplementing the earlier Geneva Conventions of 1925, 1931 and 1936 relating to drugs placed under international control, the Central Government hereby declares the narcotic substances specified in this notification to be manufactured drugs and makes the following further amendment in the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Finance (Department of Revenue) No.4- Dangerous Drugs dated 4 December 1956.

Status of the drug under the conventions

In the said notification,

- (i) item No. (41) shall be omitted.
- (ii) for item No.(75), the following item shall be substituted, namely:-
- "(75) 4-phenylpiperidine-4-carboxylic acid ethyl ester /pethidine-intermediate-B/2/ and its salts, admixtures, extracts and other substances containing any of these drugs."
