PROMULGATED TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL TREATIES ON NARCOTIC DRUGS

INDIA

Communicated by the Government of India

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL - In accordance with the relevant Articles of the International Treaties on Narcotic Drugs, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

Ministry of Finance (Department of Revenue) NOTIFICATION No. 9 - Dangerous Drugs

In pursuance of sub-clause (ii) of clause (g) of section 2 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1930 (2 of 1930), and the Protocol signed at Paris on 19 November 1948, supplementing the earlier Geneva Conventions of 1925, 1931 and 1936 relating to drugs placed under international control, the Central Government hereby declares the narcotic substance, "1-(3 cyano-3, 3-diphenylpropyl)-4-(1-piperidino) piperidine-4-carboxylic acid amide (also known under the designations Piritramide and R.3365) and its salts, preparations, admixtures, extracts and other substances containing any of these drugs" to be a manufactured drug and makes the following further amendment to the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Finance (Department of Revenue) No. 4 - Dangerous Drugs dated 4 December 19562, namely:

In the said notification, after item number (81), the following item shall be added, namely:

Status of the drug under the conventions

"(82) 1- (3 cyano-3,3-diphenylpropyl)4-(1-piperidino) piperidine-4carboxylic acid amide (also known
under the designation <u>Piritramide</u>
and R.3365) and its salts,
preparations, admixtures, extracts
and other substances containing
any of these drugs."
