PROCLAMATION No. 8 OF 1956

TO EXTEND THE APPLICATION OF PART IV OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ORDINANCE, 1950¹⁾

WHEREAS by Section 10 of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1950, it is enacted that if the Governor is satisfied, on representation made to him in that behalf, that any new derivative of morphine or cocaine or of any salts of morphine or cocaine or any other alkaloid of opium or any other drug of whatever kind is, or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, or is capable of being converted into a substance which is or is likely to be, productive, if improperly used, of ill-effects substantially of the same character or nature as, or analogous to, those produced by the substances mentioned in section 9 of the said Ordinance, the Governor may by Proclamation declare that Part IV of the said Ordinance shall apply to that new derivative or alkaloid or other drug in the same manner as it applies to the drugs mentioned in the said section 9;

AND WHEREAS I am satisfied, on representation made to me, that the drugs specified in the Schedule to this Proclamation are, or are likely to be, productive, if improperly used, or are capable of being converted into a substance which is, or is likely to be, productive, if improperly used, of ill-effects substantially of the same character or nature as, or analogous to, those produced by the substances mentioned in the said section 9:

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 10 of the said Ordinance I do hereby proclaim and order as follows:-

- (1) This Proclamation may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1950 (Application) Proclamation, 1956.
- (2) Part IV of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1950, shall apply to the drugs specified in the Schedule to this Proclamation in the same manner as the said Part IV applies to the Drugs mentioned in section 9 of that Ordinance.

1,3-dimethyl-4-phenyl-4-propionoxyhexamethyleneimine / Proheptazine ³⁾ /, its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of 1,3-dimethyl-4-phenyl-4-propionoxyhexamethyleneimine.

3-hydroxy-N-phenethylmorphinan / Phenomorphin /, its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of 3-hydroxy-N-phenethylmorphinan.

4-morpholino-2,2-diphenyl ethyl butyrate / Dioxapheryl butyrate /, its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of 4-morpholino-2,2-diphenyl ethyl butyrate.

4-dimethylamino-1,2-diphenyl-3-methyl-2-propionoxybutane / Propoxyphene /, its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of 4-dimethylamino-1,2-diphenyl - 3-methyl-2-propionoxybutane.
