Note by the Secretary-General

In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 1931 for limiting the Manufacture and regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to forward to the Members of the United Nations and to the other parties to the Convention the following law communicated by the Government of the United Kingdom.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 71 of 1948.

The Dangerous Drugs Ordinance. (Cap. 97.)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section two of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance the Governor in Council hereby declares the following to be habit-forming drugs:

Amidone (d1-2-dimethylamino-4: 4-diphenylheptane-5-one), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of amidone. Methyldihydromorphinone (commonly known as Metopon), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of methyldihydromorphinone.

The list of habit-forming drugs contained in section two of such Ordinance is amended accordingly.
