AN ORDINANCE FURTHER TO AMEND THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ORDINANCE

[6th July, 1954]

ENACTED by the Governor of the Nyasaland Protectorate, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs (Amendment) Ordinance, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance).
