NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL-- In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

NOTIFICATION DANGEROUS DRUGS

No. S.R.O.217

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-clause (ii) of clause (g) of section 2 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1930 (II of 1930), and in pursuance of a recommendation of the World Health Organization made in accordance with Article 1 of the Protocol of the 19th November 1948, Bringing under International Control Drugs Outside the Scope of the Convention of the 13th July, 1931, for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of the 11th December 1946, the Central Government is pleased to declare the following drugs and their salts to be "manufactured drugs" namely:

1. Normorphine^{1/}
2. Dimethylaminoethyl 1-ethoxy-1,1-diphenylacetate
(International non-proprietary name "dimenoxadol").
