In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ORDINANCE, 1923-1950 of the Territory of Papua

NOTICE OF DECLARATION OF DANGEROUS DRUGS

I, Jack Keith Murray, the Administrator of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Second Schedule to the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1923-1950, of the Territory of Papua and all other powers me enabling, hereby declare the following to be Dangerous Drugs for the purpose of the said Ordinances:-

1. Hydrochloride of 1-methyl-4-phenyl-piperidine-4-carboxylic acid ethyl ester, whether known under the names of Dolantin, Demerol, Pethridine, Dolosal or Isonipeaine or otherwise.

2. Preparations made from extract or tincture of Indian Hemp.

3. dl-2-dimethylamino-4; 4-diphenylhepten-5-one hydrochloride whether known under the names of Amidone, Methadon, Physeptone, Dolophine or Adanon or otherwise and any other drug of the "Amidone" group whether known by any of the foregoing names or otherwise.

4. Methyldihydromorphine Hydrochloride (Metopon Hydrochloride) a morphine derivative.
