Note by the Secretary-General

In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 1931 for limiting the Manufacture and regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to forward to the Members of the United Nations and to the other parties to the Convention the following law communicated by the Government of Poland.

CIRCULAR NO. 71

TO ALL CUSTOMS DIRECTORS AND OFFICES

The Ministry of the Treasury authorizes all Customs Offices, until revocation, to dispense, without permission of the Ministry of the Treasury and without presentation of a physician's prescription, drugs coming from abroad weighing up to 2 kilogrammes including packing.

This authorization does not concern parcels containing narcotics which should be discharged according to decisions 24 dz.III p.5 of the executive regulations for the customs law with exception of ethylmorphine (dionine) and codeine, the quantity of which may not exceed 200 grammes in one parcel including packing. Codeine and ethylmorphine (dionine) may also, be a part of other imported medicines.
