Note by the Secretary-General

In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 1931 for limiting the Manufacture and regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to forward to the Members of the United Nations and to the other parties to the Convention the following law communicated by the Government of the United Kingdom.

No. S 96. THE OPIUM AND CHANDU PROCLAMATION
(Proclamation No. 43).

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Comptroller by section 22 of the Opium and Chandu Proclamation the Comptroller of Customs by virtue of section 2 of the Transfer of Powers and Interpretation Ordinance, 1946, with the approval of the Governor hereby makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the Opium and Chandu (Amendment) Rules, 1946.

2. Rule 15 of the Opium and Chandu Rules is hereby amended by substituting for the words "a Chemist" appearing in line 2 thereof the words "a Chemist of the Department of Chemistry, Singapore" and for the word "chemist" appearing in line 6 thereof the word "Chemist".
