RESOLVED: Whereas the Government of Venezuela has received a communication from the Permanent Central Opium Board of the United Nations informing it of the recommendation that the control measures established in the Protocol signed at Paris on 19 November 1948 should be applied to the drug known as "Hydrochloride of diphenylmorpholino heptane" registered in Venezuela under the trade name "HEPTALIN", this Ministry, in conformity with Article 42 of the Narcotics Act, orders that the above-mentioned drug and any pharmaceutical preparations containing it which may subsequently be registered shall be included among the drugs to which the Narcotics Act refers.
