LAWS AND REGULATIONS

PROMULGATED TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONVENTION OF 13 JULY 1931 FOR LIMITING THE MANUFACTURE AND REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS, AS AMENDED BY THE PROTOCOL OF 11 DECEMBER 1946

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL-- In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

RESOLUTION No.10

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED:

Whereas the Government of Venezuela has been informed by the United Nations Permanent Central Opium Board of the existence of a recommendation that the measures of control laid down in the Protocol signed in Paris on 19 November 1948 should be applied to the drug "d-2,2-diphenyl-3-methyl-4-morpholino-butyryl-pyrrolidine" /dextromoramide^{1/} ((+)-4-(2-methyl-4-oxo-3,3-diphenyl-4-(1-pyrrolidinyl) butyl) morpholine)2/ and its salts, registered in Venezuela under the name of "PALFIUM" (tablets) and that the said drug should come under the provisions laid down in the 1931 Convention for the drugs specified in Group I of paragraph 2 of article 1 of that Convention, this Ministry, in conformity with article 42 of the Narcotic Drugs Act, hereby directs that the above-mentioned drug, its salts and likewise all pharmaceutical specialities containing it which may in future be registered, shall be included among the drugs covered by the Narcotic Drugs Act.
