LAWS AND REGULATIONS

PROMULGATED TO GIVE EFFECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONVENTION OF 13 JULY 1931 FOR LIMITING THE MANUFACTURE AND REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS, AS AMENDED BY THE PROTOCOL OF 11 DECEMBER 1946

NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL.—In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 13 July 1931 for Limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to communicate the following legislative text.

By virtue of Article 79, section 6, of the Constitutional Law, and with reference to Article 2 of the Narcotic Drugs Act 1) and to Article 21 of the Medicinal Substances Regulations (Sluzbeni List FNRI, No. 45/53)2), the Federal Executive Council hereby promulgates the following

DECREE

EMPOWERING THE COMMISSION ON MEDICINAL SUBSTANCES TO DECLARE PRODUCTS AS NARCOTIC DRUGS AND TO SPECIFY THE DRUGS WHICH MUST BE SUBJECTED TO SPECIAL INVESTIGATION.

The Commission on Medicinal Substances of the Federal Public Health Institute is hereby authorized, subject to the approval of the Federal Executive Council:

- (a) to declare as narcotic drugs, within the meaning of Article 2 of the Narcotic Drugs Act, such products as are shown to be capable of producing addiction or of being converted into addiction-producing drugs.
- (b) to specify the drugs, within the meaning of Article 21 of the Medicinal Substances Regulations, which may be marketed only after special investigation by the institutions appointed for that purpose.
- 2. This Decree enters into force on the day of its publication in the "Sluzbeni List FNRJ".
