Statement on the situation in Haiti made on 2 October 1991 at Basseterre by the Chairman of the Caribbean Community

The Caribbean Community is deeply shocked by the action of elements of the armed forces of Haiti in illegally seizing President

Jean-Bertrand Aristide and members of his administration and usurping the authority of the duly constituted Government freely chosen by the Haitian people to manage their affairs.

This outrageous action by the Haitian military is an unacceptable expression of cynical contempt for the declared will of the people of Haiti, which was overwhelmingly and unambiguously manifested in the elections of December 1990. The Caribbean Community condemns unreservedly this flagrant assault on the unfolding democratic process in Haiti, and demands the restoration of constitutional order and of Father Aristide to the Presidency of the Republic.

CARICOM believes that this latest act of repression by the Haitian military proves the correctness of its call in the past for concerned international assistance to consolidate democratic gains in Haiti, and once more calls upon the international community to take all appropriate measures to restore democracy and the constitutionally elected Government of Haiti.
