Letter dated 25 February 1987 from the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of  
Pakistan to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to our letter dated 10 February 1987 (A/42/124-S/18684), I have the honour to report to you a serious incident in violation of Pakistan airspace from the Afghanistan side, which occurred on 20 February 1987. On that date, at 1545 hours (Pakistan standard time), eight Afghan fighter aircraft penetrated Pakistan airspace by about 20 kilometres and dropped four bombs in the Arandu area in Chitral District, as a result of which three civilians were injured.

The Afghan Chargé d'affaires was summoned to the Foreign Office at Islamabad on 24 February 1987, and a strong protest was lodged with him over this unprovoked attack.
