#### I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The present report is submitted in accordance with the requests contained in General Assembly resolution 2736 (XXV) of 17 December 1970, on the composition of the Secretariat and resolution 2715 (XXV) of 15 December 1970, on the employment of qualified women in senior and other professional positions by the secretariats of organizations in the United Nations system. Although the latter resolution was adopted on the recommendation of the Third Committee, which had considered the subject in the context of the report of the Economic and Social Council, the Secretary-General has decided to deal with it in the present report because of its substance, which concerns the recruitment policy of the Secretariat, and because of the concurrent request addressed to him by the Fifth Committee in its report on the item entitled "Personnel questions" to the Assembly at its two y-fifth session. 1/
- 2. After an interpretation of General Assembly resolution 2736 (XXV) in the light of the basic recruitment policies laid down by the Assembly in its resolution 1852 (XVII), of 19 December 1962, the present report provides a review of the measures taken in application of the guidelines approved in 1970. Section IV refers to resolution 2715 (XXV), while the main changes which have taken place in the composition of the Secretariat over the past year are noted in Section V.
- 3. Unlike previous reports, this one contains no recommendations for the consideration of the General Assembly at its current session. The Secretary-General believes that it would be preferable to await the outcome of the review entrusted by the Assembly to the Special Committee for the Review of the United Nations Salary System and of the follow-up action proposed by Mr. Maurice Bertrand of the Joint Inspection Unit in his report on personnel problems in the United Nations (A/8454) before new recommendations on recruitment policy are formulated.
- 4. The statistical tables in the annex below have been arranged in two parts: the first consists of regional summaries which highlight the main trends, and the second gives the customary nationality tables. In addition, as requested in General Assembly resolution 2736 C (XXV), the tables on the composition of the staff of the United Nations Development Programme and the United Nations Children's Fund show the geographical distribution both by nationality and by region.

#### II. THE 1970 RECRUITMENT GUIDELINES

5. The General Assembly, by resolution 2736 A (XXV), approved a number of guidelines for the recruitment of Professional and higher-level staff in the Secretariat. These guidelines dealt with:

- (a) Recruitment of staff for posts subject to geographical distribution in general, and for posts in the regional economic commissions in particular;
- $(\underline{b})$  Recruitment of staff for posts involving complex duties and responsibilities;
- (c) Service requirements for transfer of staff after recruitment; and
  - (d) Special measures for the recruitment of young entrants.
- 6. The resolution, in its operative paragraph 2 (a), reiterates the principle that candidates for recruitment who meet the standards of efficiency, competence and integrity laid down in the Charter and are nationals of under-represented countries should be given preference over other candidates. This principle applies to the filling of all administrative and substantive posts, but has particular relevance to those of the higher levels.
- 7. A new application of the principle of regional balance in the composition of the Secretariat was introduced in paragraph 2 (a) of the resolution, which provided that, in the recruitment of staff for a regional economic commission, preference should be given to candidates who are nationals of countries in the region, first to those who are from under-represented countries and then, if such candidates are not available, to those who are from countries not fully represented. For this purpose, a country may be regarded as not fully represented if the number of its nationals in the Secretariat is below the upper limit of its desirable range. The preference to be given to regional candidates, however, is subject to the over-all limitation indicated by the regional desirable range.
- 8. The significance of this provision of the resolution lies in the recognition of the policy of staffing the secretarists of the regional economic commissions predominantly by nationals of the countries of the region. That policy, to which the Secretary-General referred in his report on the composition of the Secretariat 2/ submitted to the General Assembly at its twenty-fifth session, is designed to achieve a desirable combination of staff, 75 per cent of whom are from the region and 25 per cent from other regions.
- 9. Under the terms of paragraph 2 (b) of the resolution, posts of complex duties and responsibilities are to be filled preferentially by candidates who are willing to accept a career appointment or a fixed-term appointment of not less than five years, including the probationary period sufficient duration to permit them to attain a high level of efficiency. This provision elaborates the principle endorsed by the General Assembly in resolution 2539 (XXIV), which recognized that long-term service is conducive to greater efficiency in certain posts of complex duties and responsibilities. The new element introduced in the 1970 resolution is the extension of the concept of probation to fixed-term appointments of five years or more. The intent of the provision is thus to facilitate the recruitment of staff for longer periods by offering them initial periods of five years or more, and by making such appointments subject to review at the end of the trial period.

- 10. In paragraph 2 (c), the resolution establishes the condition of a minimum period of service in the post for which a staff member was recruited before he may be transferred to another post. This provision is intended to meet the problem of higher staff turnover in certain offices and of diminished efficiency resulting from it to which recent reports by the Joint Inspection Unit have drawn attention.
- ll. Finally, in paragraph 2  $(\underline{d})$ , the resolution calls for special efforts to be made to recruit young men and women through the development of more objective selection methods, such as competitive examinations. It provides, at the same time, that special allowance should be made for candidates whose mother tongue is not one of the working languages of the Secretariat.

#### III. APPLICATION OF THE GUIDELINES

- 12. In applying these guidelines, during the past year, the Secretary-General took into account the basic principles and standards laid down in General Assembly resolution 1852 (XVII), under which the present system of desirable ranges for each nationality and region operates. In conformity with those principles and standards, the 1970 guidelines served as additional indicators of the manner in which the staffing needs of the Secretariat should be met, subject always to the paramount consideration of professional and personal suitability.
- 13. As part of his continuing effort to recruit staff from under-represented countries, the Secretary-General authorized two special recruitment missions, one to Japan and the other to the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics. In view of the large proportion of vacancies in the field of economic and social development, each mission included both a representative of the Office of Personnel and a member of one of the substantive departments directly concerned. A similar team attended the annual conference of a professional association in the United States of America, which included among its members nationals of many countries. In addition, the regional economic commissions, especially the Economic Commission for Africa, were invited to assist in the search for candidates from under-represented countries. And the annual circular of vacancies, which is sent with three quarterly supplements to all Member States, UNDP resident representatives, specialized agencies and other selective sources, was amended to announce all vacancies anticipated during the year 1971, including posts currently encumbered on a fixed-term basis by nationals of over-represented countries.
- 14. As a result of these and other endeavours, nearly two thirds of the 238 appointments granted to nationals of Member States 3/ for posts subject to geographical distribution were granted to candidates of countries which, on 31 August 1970, had been at or below the lower limit of the desirable range (63 appointments) or to countries within the desirable range (94 appointments). The remaining 81 appointments (34 per cent) were approved for nationals of over-represented countries. As in the past, such appointments were made only after it had become apparent that qualified candidates from other countries

were not available or could not be found in time to meet the needs of established work programmes. In most cases, these were fixed-term appointments, thus allowing for the selection of candidates from other countries at the end of the term.

- 15. Special attention was paid to the improvement of geographical distribution at the senior (Director and Principal Officer) levels. The efforts deployed in this direction resulted in the appointment of three nationals of under-represented countries (one from Mali and two from the USSR) out of a total of 12 appointments made during the year to such posts.
- 16. Of the 22 staff appointed for posts in the Economic Commission for Africa, 11 were nationals of countries in the region. In recognition of the need for a better linguistic balance in the secretariat of that Commission, 3 more staff members were appointed from French-speaking countries of the region, even though these countries were already over-represented in the Secretariat as a whole.
- 17. In the filling of posts of complex duties and responsibilities, which are usually those requiring continuity of service before the job is mastered, an effort was made to seek out candidates willing to accept career or long-term appointments. As an insufficient number of such candidates could be found from nationals of under-represented countries, only 21 out of a total of 51 appointments to posts of this kind were on a probationary (19) or long-term (2) basis. This represents 41 per cent of all appointments to those posts, whereas in other areas only 28 per cent of the new staff were appointed for career or long-term service.
- 18. Many of the posts filled during the year under review required staff of substantial experience in their particular field of work. Nevertheless, 93 (38 per cent) of the 247 recruits were at the age of 35 or below and 11 of that number were recent university graduates.

#### IV. GENERAL ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 2715 (XXV)

- 19. In this resolution, which was adopted on the recommendation of the Third Committee pursuant to resolution 1510 (XLVIII) of the Economic and Social Council, the General Assembly urged the United Nations and its related agencies "to take or continue to take appropriate measures to ensure equal opportunities for the employment of qualified women in senior and other professional positions" and requested the Secretary-General to include, in his report on the composition of the Secretariat, data on the employment of women in such positions.
- 20. The matter was concurrently raised in the Fifth Committee in the context of its consideration of personnel questions. The Fifth Committee decided to include, in its report to the General Assembly, a paragraph in which it requested the Secretary-General:
- (a) To encourage Governments of Hembers States to make available qualified women for positions in the Secretariat, particularly at the senior level;
- $(\underline{b})$  To continue to ensure that the appointment and promotion of staff was done without distinction as to sex;

- (c) To adhere to the request of the Economic and Social Council in its resolution 1510 (XLVIII) and include in his report to the General Assembly at its twenty-sixth session the data on women employed in the Secretariat.
- 21. The General Assembly took note of this decision of the Fifth Committee at its 1933rd plenary meeting, on 17 December 1970.
- 22. Fending a fuller consideration of the subject in accordance with rule 99 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, the Secretary-General believes that the two requests referred to above will best be met by appending to the the present report, which is concerned only with the United Nations regular Secretariat, a more detailed table on the employment of women in the United Nations and a summary table for the organizations based on the figures provided by them.

#### V. CHANGES IN THE COMPOSITION OF THE STAFF

- 23. During the year under review, the number of nationalities represented in the Secretariat increased from 118, including four from non-member States, to 122, of which five were from non-member States. The number of Member States increased during the same period from 126 to 127. Of the 10 nationalities not represented in the Secretariat, six were from countries in Africa.
- 24. In terms of regional distribution, the largest net increase of staff was registered by North America and the Caribbean (6.7 per cent), followed by Latin America (5.6 per cent), Africa (4.4 per cent), Western Europe (3.0 per cent) and the Middle East (2.0 per cent). The two regions which shared a slight loss were Asia and the Far East (0.6 per cent) and Eastern Europe (0.4 per cent).
- 25. The latter two regions also declined in relation to the targets represented by the desirable ranges for each geographical region, the proportion of staff from Asia and the Far East having decreased from 15.8 to 15.1 per cent, as compared to the target of 17.0 per cent, and that of Eastern Europe from 12.2 to 11.7 per cent, as compared to the target of 16.5 per cent. During the same period, the third under-represented region, North America and the Caribbean, recorded an increase from 22.8 to 23.5 per cent, while the present target is 26.2. The proportion of staff of the other four regions remains above their targets.
- 26. Of the factors entering into these regional shifts, the disparity in the rate of separations continues to be one of particular importance. While the largest number of appointments made during the year were granted to nationals of North American countries (64), followed by Western Europe (49) and Eastern Europe (37), the largest number of separations were those of nationals of Western Europe (41), followed by Eastern Europe (40) and North America (37). These figures represent a rate of separation of 15.2 for Eastern Europe, as compared to 8.1 for Western Europe and 7.1 for North America. Moreover, of the 188 staff who were separated during the year, 109 held fixed-term appointments, 38 of whom left before the expiration of their contract. Thus, the rate of resignations for fixed-term staff was 5.0 as against 2.9 for career staff. As the regions differ in their proportion of fixed-term staff, the higher rate of separations in general and of resignations in particular for such staff means that different recruitment efforts are required in the various regions.

- 27. A significant change in this regard took place during the past year. North America was the only region in which there was an increase in the proportion of fixed-term staff, while in all other regions there was a decrease. These reductions were in part achieved through the conversion of fixed-term appointments to probationary appointments.
- 28. Another factor in the regional changes was the number of staff in the General Service category who were promoted to Professional posts. Of 39 such promotions during the year, 11 were awarded to nationals of countries in North America, 8 in Western Europe and 5 in Asia and the Far East.
- 29. Finally, the region with the largest increase in the number of staff holding senior positions was Western Europe (9), followed by Asia and the Far East (6) and North America and the Caribbean (5).
