Addendum

1. The Committee for the Twenty-fifth Anniversary of the United Nations recommends that, in addition to the statements to be made by the Secretary-General and the President of the General Assembly (see A/8060, para.2 (b)), representatives of five regional groups might make short statements, not much longer than five minutes each, at the ceremony to take place on 24 October 1970. Each group will designate a speaker. In considering the appropriate level of each speaker, the group will bear in mind the nature of the special commemoration to take place on that day.
2. The Committee recommends that a special ceremony may be organized on 14 October 1970 in order to observe the tenth anniversary of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples. Speakers for the occasion might include the Secretary-General, the President of the General Assembly and the Chairman of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples. The ceremony might take place, after the adoption of the programme of action submitted by the Special Committee (A/8086, para.-40), in the late afternoon of 14 October 1970.
