Second report of the Committee for the Twenty-fifth Anniversary of the United Nations

Rapporteur: Mr. Giovanni MIGLIUOLO (Italy)

- 1. At the 1864th plenary meeting of the General Assembly, the President of the Assembly summarized the debate on the item entitled "Celebration of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the United Nations" by stating that there was a consensus to the effect that all the proposed amendments submitted to the plenary should be referred to the Committee for the Twenty-fifth Anniversary of the United Nations, which would consider them and report back to the General Assembly in two days. He informed the General Assembly that the sponsors of the amendments would be welcome to participate in the Committee's deliberations. The President expressed the hope that at the time of the resumption of the consideration of the item in plenary there would be no need for another debate. At its 1863rd plenary meeting, the General Assembly had agreed to make the end of that meeting the deadline for the acceptance of amendments.
- 2. Under the above mandate given by the General Assembly, the Committee for the Twenty-fifth Anniversary of the United Nations has held eight meetings devoted to the consideration of the various amendments submitted to the Assembly. These amendments were submitted by Chile (A/L.592 and Corr.1), by Bulgaria (A/L.593), by twenty-four African States (A/L.594 and Corr.1), by Romania (A/L.596 and Corr.1),
