Chapter I

Organizational matters

A. Membership

1. Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 43/222 B, in 2017 the Committee on Conferences was composed of the following Member States: Austria, Bahrain, the Central African Republic, France, Germany, Ghana, Guyana, Hungary, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Jamaica, Japan, Kenya, Liberia, Morocco, Namibia, Paraguay, the Russian Federation, Sri Lanka and the United States of America.¹

B. Officers

2. At its organizational session for 2017 (547th meeting), held on 21 June 2017, the Committee elected the following officers to serve in 2017:

3. Also at its organizational session, the Committee agreed in principle that the Chair would undertake informal consultations with a view to determining the composition of its Bureau for 2018 and that the outgoing Chair and members of the Bureau would continue in their capacity until the 2018 Bureau was elected.

C. Organization of work

4. At its organizational session, the Committee agreed to follow the guidelines adopted in 1994 and 1995 with regard to its consideration of intersessional departures from the approved calendar of conferences and meetings and to meet, as required, to review proposals affecting the schedule of conferences and meetings during sessions of the General Assembly.

5. At the same session, the Assistant Secretary-General for General Assembly and Conference Management addressed the Committee. Representatives of the Secretariat answered questions raised by the delegations of Guyana, Iran (Islamic Republic of) and Morocco.

6. Also at the same session, the Secretary of the Committee introduced the provisional calendar of conferences and meetings in the economic, social and related fields for 2018 and 2019 (E/2017/L.20). The Committee reviewed the provisional calendar and recommended it for adoption by the Economic and Social Council. The recommendation of the Committee was transmitted in a letter dated 27 June 2017 from the Chair of the Committee on Conferences to the President of the Economic and Social Council (E/2017/78).

7. The Committee held its substantive session from 5 to 11 September 2017 (548th to ___th meetings). At the opening of the substantive session, on 5 September, the Under-Secretary-General for General Assembly and Conference Management introduced the report of the Secretary-General on the pattern of conferences (A/72/116). During the formal meetings, statements were made by the representatives of Afghanistan, Austria, Azerbaijan, France, Guyana, India, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Iraq, Kenya, Morocco, Paraguay, the Russian Federation, Tajikistan, Turkey and the United States of America.

D. Programme of work

8. At its organizational session for 2016 (541st meeting), held on 25 April 2016, the Committee requested the Secretariat to submit the provisional agenda for 2017 to the Committee at its organizational session for 2017. At its organizational session for 2017 (547th meeting), held on 21 June 2017, the Committee adopted the provisional agenda (A/AC.172/2017/L.1) and requested the Secretariat to submit a provisional agenda for 2018 to the Committee at its organizational session for 2018. The Committee also decided to include in its programme of work for the year, prior to the Committee's substantive session or upon request, informal briefings by the Secretariat on issues of interest to Member States relating to conference management.

E. Participation of observers

9. Two Member States, Israel and Turkey, were represented as observers at the organizational session of the Committee. Fourteen Member States, namely, Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Cuba, Greece, India, Iraq, Israel, Kyrgyzstan, Malaysia, Nepal, Pakistan, Tajikistan, Turkey and Turkmenistan, as well as one intergovernmental organization, the International Organization of la Francophonie, were represented as observers at the substantive session.

Chapter II

Meetings management

A. Adoption of the draft biennial calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations for 2018 and 2019

10. At its 548th meeting, on 5 September 2017, the Committee considered a letter addressed to the Chair of the Committee ([A/AC.172/2017/3](#)) dated 6 March 2017 from the Permanent Representatives of Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, India, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Iraq, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Tajikistan, Turkey, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan to the United Nations. The Committee agreed to further discuss, during informal consultations at its current session, the request for Nowruz to be included in the list of non-official holidays of the United Nations.

11. The Committee also reviewed and adopted the draft biennial calendar of conferences and meetings for 2018 and 2019 ([A/AC.172/2017/L.2](#)).

Discussion

12. A number of delegations expressed their support for the inclusion of Nowruz in the list of non-official holidays.

13. One delegation asked whether there were guidelines for proposing and designating non-official holidays and sought clarification regarding the implications of including additional holidays in the programme of work and operations of the United Nations. A representative of the Secretariat said that there were no such guidelines. When the question of including additional holidays had become raised in previous years, there had been much discussion about whether the issue fell within the remit of the Committee at all. However, since no other committee was mandated to do so, the Committee on Conferences had become the forum for discussing such questions. The representative further explained that if the request were approved by the General Assembly, United Nations bodies at all duty stations would be encouraged, but not obliged, not to hold official meetings on the date of Nowruz.

14. Several delegations said that it would be useful to clarify the criteria for proposing and approving the inclusion of additional holidays in the list of non-official holidays. The representative of the Secretariat clarified that there were currently no such guidelines. Another delegation requested that the issue be examined further.

15. A number of delegations said that they wished to discuss the inclusion of Nowruz further during the consideration of the draft resolution on the pattern of conferences.

16. With regard to the draft biennial calendar of conferences and meetings for 2018 and 2019, one delegation said that the second part of the resumed session of the Fifth Committee should be extended to enable the Committee to complete its work. The allotted period of four weeks was not sufficient. In addition, overlap between the sessions of the Fifth Committee and the Committee for Programme and Coordination posed a challenge for both conference services and delegates. The delegation asked the Secretariat to provide a table detailing the scheduled opening and closing dates of the sessions of the Committee for Programme and Coordination and the second part of the resumed session of the Fifth Committee, as well as of ad hoc formal meetings held after the scheduled closing dates and the actual closing dates of the second part of the resumed session of the Fifth Committee, for the previous five years.

17. One delegation noted that in 2017, Eid al-Adha had fallen on 1 September, yet the United Nations had declared the holiday to be 31 August. A representative of the Secretariat explained that of the two possible dates provided by the Organization of Islamic Cooperation at the start of the year, the United Nations had selected 31 August, as having the holiday on 1 September would have delayed the start of the seventy-second session of the General Assembly by one week.

B. Requests for exceptions to section I, paragraph 7, of General Assembly resolution 40/243

18. At its 548th meeting, on 5 September 2017, the Committee considered the sections of the report of the Secretary-General on the pattern of conferences (A/72/116, sect. II.B, and supplementary information,² sect. I.A) containing information on the requests received for exceptions to section I, paragraph 7, of General Assembly resolution 40/243, by which the Assembly decided that no subsidiary organ of the Assembly might meet at United Nations Headquarters during a regular session of the Assembly unless explicitly authorized by the Assembly.

Conclusions and recommendations

19. **The Committee recommended that the General Assembly explicitly authorize the following bodies to meet in New York during the main part of its seventy-second session, on the understanding that all such meetings would be allocated conference services on an “as available” basis, in such a way that the work of the Assembly and its Main Committees would not be impeded:**

- (a) **Committee on Relations with the Host Country;**
- (b) **Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People;**
- (c) **Executive Board of the United Nations Development Programme, the United Nations Population Fund and the United Nations Office for Project Services;**
- (d) **Executive Board of the United Nations Children’s Fund;**
- (e) **Independent Audit Advisory Committee;**
- (f) **Assembly of States Parties to the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court.**

C. Intersessional departures

20. The General Assembly, in its resolution 71/262, approved the draft revised calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations for 2017, as submitted by the Committee on Conferences, and authorized the Committee to make any adjustments that might become necessary as a result of actions and decisions taken by the Assembly at its seventy-first session. The calendar was issued as A/AC.172/2017/2.

21. The Committee on Conferences approved the following requests:

- (a) Request from the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions to extend its autumn session of 2016 by three days in order to provide the Committee’s report to the General Assembly in a timely manner;

(b) Request from the Advisory Board on Disarmament Matters to convene its sixty-seventh session in Geneva rather than in New York, from 25 to 27 January 2017;

(c) Request from the Independent Audit Advisory Committee to hold its thirty-eighth session in Vienna from 19 to 21 April 2017;

(d) Request from the chairs of the human rights treaty bodies to hold their twenty-ninth annual meeting in New York instead of in Geneva, from 27 to 30 June 2017;

(e) Request from the Board of Auditors to hold its forty-seventh special session in Rome instead of in New York, on 1 December 2017;

(f) Request from the Panel of External Auditors of the United Nations, the Specialized Agencies and the International Atomic Energy Agency to hold its fifty-eighth session in Rome instead of in New York, on 30 November and 1 December 2017;

(g) Request from the Independent Audit Advisory Committee to extend its fortieth session by one day, from 12 to 15 December 2017, to enable the United Nations system oversight committees to meet, hosted by the Committee in the context of its fortieth session;

(h) Request from the Independent Audit Advisory Committee to hold its forty-first session in Nairobi instead of in New York, from 21 to 23 April 2018.

D. Utilization of conference-servicing resources by United Nations organs

22. At its 548th meeting, on 5 September 2017, the Committee on Conferences considered the section of the report containing an analysis of the utilization of conference-servicing resources by United Nations organs (A/72/116, paras. 10-14, and supplementary information, sects. I.C and I.D).

23. The Chair said that, as in previous years, letters would be sent to the presiding officers of the calendar bodies whose utilization rate had fallen below the 80 per cent benchmark over the previous six years.

Discussion

24. One representative said that the formula for calculating the rate of utilization of conference-servicing resources and facilities was not sufficient, as it did not factor in the occupancy rate of meeting rooms or the actual number of working days, and asked the Secretariat to examine the possibility of expanding the formula. A representative of the Secretariat said that the formula applied to the use of interpretation services, not meeting rooms. The occupancy rate of some rooms was low because they were reserved for the meetings of specific bodies, but the occupancy rate of most rooms, in particular small and medium-sized ones, was extremely high.

E. Provision of interpretation services to meetings of bodies entitled to meet “as required”

25. At the same meeting, the Committee considered the section of the report concerning the provision of interpretation services to meetings of bodies entitled to meet “as required” (A/72/116, para. 15, and supplementary information, sect. I.D).

F. Provision of interpretation services to meetings of regional and other major groupings of Member States

26. Also at the same meeting, the Committee considered the section of the report concerning the provision of interpretation services to meetings of regional and other major groupings of Member States (A/72/116, paras. 16-18, and supplementary information, sect. I.D).

G. Meetings held away from established headquarters

27. Also at its 548th meeting, the Committee considered the section of the report concerning meetings held away from established headquarters (A/72/116, paras. 21 and 22, and supplementary information, sect. I.F).

H. Utilization of conference facilities at the United Nations Office at Nairobi

28. At the same meeting, the Committee considered the section of the report concerning the utilization of conference facilities at the United Nations Office at Nairobi (A/72/116, para. 19, and supplementary information, sect. I.D).

I. Utilization of the conference centre at the Economic Commission for Africa

29. Also at the same meeting, the Committee considered the section of the report concerning the utilization of the conference centre at the Economic Commission for Africa (A/72/116, para. 20, and supplementary information, sect. I.D).

Chapter III

Documents management

A. Timely submission, processing and issuance of documents

30. At its 548th meeting, on 5 September 2017, the Committee considered the section of the report of the Secretary-General on the pattern of conferences concerning the timely submission, processing and issuance of documents ([A/72/116](#), paras. 25-30).

B. Simultaneous distribution of documents

31. At the same meeting, the Committee considered the section of the report concerning the simultaneous distribution of documents ([A/72/116](#), para. 31).

Discussion

32. In response to a question from one delegation, a representative of the Secretariat explained that the simultaneous distribution figures presented in the report did not reflect occasions on which advance copies in English had been made available at the request of certain meeting bodies. The Secretariat abided strictly by the simultaneous distribution rule and issued language versions as they became available only on an ad hoc basis when requested to do so by the meeting bodies. The Secretariat would provide the Committee with data on which bodies had made such requests.

C. Digitization and uploading of important older United Nations documents

33. At its 549th meeting, on 5 September 2017, the Committee considered the section of the report concerning the digitization and uploading of important older United Nations documents ([A/72/116](#), para. 32).

Chapter IV

Staffing

34. At its 549th meeting, on 5 September 2017, the Committee considered the section of the report of the Secretary-General on the pattern of conferences concerning matters relating to workload and staffing (A/72/116, paras. 37-50, and supplementary information, sect. III).

Discussion

35. A delegation requested an explanation of the productivity figures presented in table 1 and asked for data on the revision workload to be provided for all four duty stations. A representative of the Secretariat explained that the productivity figures had been calculated as the average number of words processed by each translator each day and were used to monitor improvements in productivity generated by the use of new forms of technology. The revision workload figures for Headquarters and the United Nations Office at Geneva had been provided at the request of the Member States; the figures for the other duty stations could be included as well in the next report.

36. The same delegation asked what was being done to address the lack of P-4 posts that was generating a high vacancy rate in the interpretation services at the United Nations Office at Nairobi. The delegation also asked how long candidates were kept on rosters. Representatives of the Secretariat replied that, owing to budget reductions, no requests had been made for new posts to be created. With regard to roster management, candidates remained on rosters for seven years and their data were regularly updated to ensure that they were reachable when vacancies arose.

Chapter V

Facilities and accessibility

A. Use of United Nations premises

37. At its 549th meeting, on 5 September 2017, the Committee considered the section of the report of the Secretary-General on the pattern of conferences concerning the use of United Nations premises in New York ([A/72/116](#), para. 51).

Discussion

38. A delegation suggested that, when events organized to discuss topics of a controversial nature regarding a particular Member State were to be held on United Nations premises, the Secretariat should notify the permanent mission of the Member State in question. Given that the United Nations was for the Member States and they paid for the Organization's conference facilities, the use made of those facilities should be acceptable to the Member States. A representative of the Secretariat explained that it had neither the tools nor the authority to police the content of the events held on United Nations premises. Its only mandate on the subject was to ensure that events did not violate the purposes and principles of the United Nations and were non-commercial in nature, in accordance with the administrative instruction on the use of United Nations premises for meetings, conferences, special events and exhibits ([ST/AI/416](#)).

B. Accessibility

39. At the same meeting, the Committee considered the section of the report concerning the accessibility of conference services ([A/72/116](#), paras. 53-54).

Chapter VI

Measuring the quality of conference services

40. At its 549th meeting, on 5 September 2017, the Committee considered the section of the report of the Secretary-General on the pattern of conferences concerning the measurement of the quality of conference services ([A/72/116](#), paras. 56-58).

Discussion

41. A delegation asked what action the Secretariat was taking to increase the rate of response to feedback surveys. A representative of the Secretariat explained that, although still very low, the rate had improved. Member States appeared to provide feedback only when things were not working well, notwithstanding the efforts to encourage greater participation in the surveys, including through appeals in the *Journal of the United Nations* and direct requests to the Chairs of all the intergovernmental bodies using United Nations conference services.

42. In response to another question, a representative of the Secretariat explained that the 7 per cent of survey respondents who had not rated conference services as “good”, “very good” or “excellent” had not necessarily given the services a negative rating, given that 7 per cent included those who had rated them as “satisfactory”. A more detailed summary of the ratings, including negative ratings, could be provided in the next report on the pattern of conferences. Any complaints about the quality of conference services were forwarded promptly to the corresponding division and addressed immediately to ensure that the problem would not recur.

Chapter VII

Organization of work

43. At its 549th meeting, on 5 September 2017, the Committee on Conferences considered the procedures for the participation of observers in the work of the Committee, pursuant to section II.A, paragraph 20, of General Assembly resolution [57/283](#) B, and agreed to keep them under review.
