NEED TO CONSIDER SUGGESTIONS REGARDING THE REVIEW  
OF THE CHARTER OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Note by the Secretary-General

1. In paragraph 1 of resolution 3349 (XXIX) of 17 December 1974, the General Assembly decided to establish an Ad Hoc Committee on the Charter of the United Nations, consisting of 42 members to be appointed by the President of the General Assembly with due regard for the principle of equitable geographical distribution.
2. In a communication dated 22 July 1975, the President of the General Assembly informed the Secretary-General that, following consultations with the chairmen of the regional groups, and on the basis of candidatures submitted by those groups, he had appointed the following States to be members of the Ad Hoc Committee on the Charter of the United Nations: Algeria, Argentina, Brazil, China, Colombia, Congo, Cyprus, Czechoslovakia, Ecuador, El Salvador, Finland, France, German Democratic Republic, Germany (Federal Republic of), Ghana, Greece, Guyana, India, Indonesia, Iran, Italy, Japan, Kenya, Liberia, Mexico, Nepal, Nigeria, New Zealand, Pakistan, Philippines, Poland, Rwanda, Sierra Leone, Spain, Tunisia, Turkey, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America, Venezuela, Yugoslavia and Zambia.
