SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following swmmary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/22110 of 28 January 1991, S/22110/Add.3 of 1 February 1991, S/22110/Add.13 of 25 April 1991, S/22110/Add.21 of 22 July 1991, S/22110/Add.38 of 9 October 1991 and S/22110/Add.39 of 22 October 1991.

During the week ending 19 October 1991, the Security Council took action on the following item:

The situation in Cambodia (see S/21100/Add.37)

At its 3014th meeting, on 16 October 1991, the Security Council resumed its consideration of the item, having before it the report by the Secretary-General on Cambodia (S/23097 and Add.1), that had been prepared in the light of the report of the survey mission, for the purpose of recommending to the Security Council that it authorize the establishment of a United Nations Advance Mission in Cambodia (UNAMIC), which would assume its functions as soon as the Agreement on a Comprehensive Political Settlement of the Cambodia Conflict was signed.

The President drew attention to the text of the draft resolution (S/23145), which had been prepared in the course of the Council's consultations.

The Security Council then voted on the draft resolution and adopted it unanimously as resolution 711 (1991).

Resolution 717 (1991) reads as follows:

The Security Council,

Recalling its resolution 668 (1990) of 20 September 1990, in which it endorsed the framework for a comprehensive political settlement of the Cambodia conflict of 28 August 1990, $\underline{1}$ /

<u>Taking note</u> of the draft agreements for a comprehensive political settlement of the Cambodia conflict, 2/

Welcoming the very significant progress made, on the basis of those draft agreements, towards a comprehensive political settlement which would enable the Cambodian people to exercise its inalienable right to self-determination through free and fair elections organized and conducted by the United Nations,

Welcoming in particular the election of His Royal Highness Samdech Norodom Sihanouk as the Chairman of the Supreme National Council of Cambodia.

Noting with satisfaction the other decisions taken by the Supreme National Council of Cambodia, concerning in particular the implementation of a voluntary cease-fire and the renunciation of foreign military assistance, and underlining the need for the full cooperation of the Cambodian parties,

Considering that such progress has opened the way to an early reconvening of the Paris Conference on Cambodia at ministerial level and the signing of the agreements for a comprehensive political settlement based on the framework document of 28 August 1990 and welcoming the preparations being made by the co-chairmen of the Paris Conference on Cambodia in that regard,

Convinced that such a comprehensive political settlement can offer at last a peaceful, just and durable solution to the Cambodia conflict,

<u>Taking note</u> of the request by His Royal Highness Samdech Norodom Sihanouk, Chairman of the Supreme National Council of Cambodia, for United Nations personnel to be sent to Cambodia at the earliest possible moment, $\underline{3}/$

<u>Underlining</u> the necessity of a United Nations presence in Cambodia immediately after the signing of the agreements for a comprehensive political settlement, pending the implementation of the arrangements set out in those agreements,

<u>Having considered</u>, to this end, the report of the Secretary-General proposing the establishment of a United Nations Advance Mission in Cambodia, 4/

- 1. Approves the report of the Secretary-General; 4/
- 2. Decides to establish, under its authority, a United Nations Advance Mission in Cambodia immediately after the signing of the agreements for a comprehensive political settlement and in accordance with the report of the Secretary-General, $\underline{4}$ / with members of the mission to be sent to Cambodia immediately after the signing;
- 3. <u>Calls upon</u> the Supreme National Council of Cambodia, and the Cambodian parties for their part, to cooperate fully with the United Nations Advance Mission in Cambodia and with the preparations for the implementation of the arrangements set out in the ag eements for a comprehensive political settlement;
- 4. <u>Welcomes</u> the proposal of the co-chairmen of the Paris Conference on Cambodia to reconvene the Conference at an early date at ministerial level to sign the agreements for a comprehensive political settlement of the Cambodia conflict:
- 5. Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council by 15 November 1991 on the implementation of the present resolution, and to keep the Council fully informed of further developments.
